FAIR ACTIVITIES FOR 4-H MEMBERS

- There are many fun kitchen activities open to Junior, Intermediate, and Senior members.
 Consider signing up for Lunch on the Go, My Favorite Foods, Table Setting, Bread Making, and more. If you have not submitted Activities Registration Form you may also sign up for these activities during fair.
- Cloverbuds may participate in Table Setting, and/or Lunch on the Go.
- Judging contests include most animals, art, food, clothing, garden & more!
- Clothing project members may participate in Fashion Revue, Creative Consumers, and \$10 Challenge.
- Get ready to present your Public Presentation, Equine Presentation, or Commodity Presentation.

EXHIBITING AT FAIR

- Grab an Exhibitor's Guide and read the Department rules, as well as the Section rules for the class(es) that you plan to enter. This will help you to avoid any surprises or disappointment when you arrive with your exhibit.
- Members may exhibit or compete only in the projects in which they are enrolled.
- All state and county 4-H policies apply during the fair.
- Only one item may be entered by a member in any one class, except as otherwise stated in the class rules.
- If you have questions please ask we will help you find the answer.

STILL LIFE EXHIBITS

With 4-H Still Life Check-in day arriving just around the corner on Sunday, August 5th, feel free to streamline the day by stopping by the WSU Extension office to pick up entry tags and paperwork to complete in advance.

- 1. Use the Exhibitor's Guide to determine specific info about the way each entry is categorized, such as Division/Section/Class and any additional steps or forms that need to be completed.
- 2. Write the appropriate Division/Section Class info on each exhibit tag. Organize entries by Section, and use a separate 4-H Still Life & Contest Entry form for each section.
- 3. Complete each form using the same info and description as written on the Exhibit Tag. Make sure that the exhibitor signs their name and that contact info is clear.
- 4. Complete the additional forms as needed for photography, textiles, creative arts, canned or dried foods, etc.
- 5. Bring your exhibits to the Grays Harbor Fairgrounds on 4-H entry days; Sunday, August 5 1:00-6:00 for most exhibits or Tuesday, August 7 3:00-7:00 for plant science exhibits.
- 6. Bring your friends and family to the fair and showcase your exhibits. Bring claim tickets to pick up exhibits after the fair closes on Sunday at 5:00.

- Exhibits receiving a blue ribbon placing qualify to be exhibited at the State 4-H Fair in Puyallup in September.
 - >> Don't forget the 3 x 5 cards that many still life entries require.

ANIMAL EXHIBITS

- Read your section rules, noting any rules regarding health requirements or certificates, number of entries, exhibitor meetings, attire, herdsmanship, equipment, etc.
- If you have questions for the Department Superintendent, check the exhibitor guide for contact info or ask Tracie.
- Animal entry times are Tuesday, August 7, 11:00-7:45, except rabbits and poultry, which will end at 7pm, and equine entries which take place from 2:00-4:30.
- All animals are to be left outside of the 4-H barn until checked by the veterinarian.
- Mandatory rabbit & poultry parent and exhibitor meeting Tuesday, August 7 at 7:00pm.

EQUINE EXHIBITORS

- Equine exhibitors must have satisfied their clinic and volunteer hour requirements prior to exhibiting at the fair.
- Equine entry time is Tuesday, August 7 2:00-4:30.
- Judging is mandatory for all equine exhibitors. Contest is set for Tuesday, August 7 @ 4:45.
- Mandatory equine exhibitor meeting following judging contest.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- A fun and successful fair is powered by volunteers like you!
- Pick a department or two and lend a helping hand. Departments like still life, horse, goat, rabbit, poultry, etc. could use your help.
- We need helpers before, during, and at the conclusion of fair.

VOLUNTEER HOURS

If you participated in the Grays Harbor Fair, a 4-H meeting, camp, or helped a member with their project you must report these hours. Reporting of volunteer hour's documents coverage for injuries they might sustain and it is also documentation for the liability coverage WSU provides to its volunteers. All WSU Extension Volunteers must log on to http://ext.wsu.edu/Volunteers/logon.aspx each month to report hours they worked for any WSU Extension program. Your user name will be your last name and first initial, such as "HansonT" and your initial password is password! (all lower case and include the exclamation point!) Once you log in you will have the option to change your password.
