 - c. 4-H online is available for new enrollments, with three new members. Need 4-H leaders enrolled so that they can access the member enrollment. Not a lot of changes to the 4-H online system. Credit card payments need to have the screen refreshed to access the credit card payment option.
 - d. Next NewsBlast will be coming up soon.
 - e. WA State 4-H Forum will be held in Spokane this year. Forum workshops are available on the Grays Harbor Facebook page.

- IX. County Fair:
 - a. Versatile Horseman/Outstanding Gamer Awards. Achievement Program is Thursday, November 8. The awards were \$108.29 last year. There was a motion made to spend \$60.00 per award. Betony made the motion and FarraLee seconded the motion. The motion was approved as presented. Record books are due Monday, October 1 which will be dependent on the awards.

- b. Executive team as superintendent follow-up. Need to address horses leaving fair early at the June mandatory meeting and the Tuesday meeting of fair.
- c. No superintendent search as this time.

X. State Fair:

- a. Parents not sharing the load for barn duty and need to reinforce that all 4-H members need to leave the state fair at the same time after stalls are cleaned.
- b. Mason County decorations incorporating with Grays Harbor at State Fair.
- c. Senior judging placed fifth, Intermediates score not available. Maybe incorporate a map and checklist for judging kids, need to revisit at the March meeting.
- d. Dressage counts as part of the five riding classes. Not equitable for performance riders compared to western games riders.
- e. Elma School District has indicated that students missing too much school due to state fair is an inexcusable absence and will be turned in to the Becca Bill. Need to take a written note to each of the teachers and have passing grades.
- XI. Elections: Treasurer and Vice President are up for elections. Nominations are open and will be voted on in November. Gwen Carrell made the motion to nominate FarraLee as treasurer. Peggy seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. If no other nominations come forth, Gwen Carrell said she will consider election as vice-president.
