
## 4-H SUMMER CAMP LEADERSHIP TRAINING FOR YOUTH




#### **OFFICE HOURS WITH TRACIE & HEATHER**

WSU 4-H Scholarship Applications are now open. There are a variety of scholarships available! The deadline to apply is March 15, 2022.

Scholarships are available to all enrolled 12<sup>th</sup> grade 4-Hers who have accumulated at least 2 years of 4-H participation. An applicant must have an approved 4-H enrollment prior to application deadline.
