7. Old business

- a. Hairy Horse Show Additional riders registered for performance classes on the day of the event
- b. Tack Swap Seemed to go well with almost nothing left. Remaining clothes donated.
- c. Silent Auction Additional community members attended specifically to bid on silent auction items. The event brought in \$1000 and the group is interested in continuing this fundraiser in the future.
- d. Storage Unit Updated Fee Schedule The GH 4-H Horse Council was notified that rent was changing to \$135/month, which would bring the fee to \$810 for 6 months, compared to the previous rate of \$280 for 6 months. If needed, Jessica has offered to store the equipment in her heated storage unit in the short term.
 - > Jessica will connect with the storage company to let them know that June will be our last month.
 - > Jessica will explore options for storing the equipment so that everything can be moved after the PreFair event June 18/19 since this change will go into effect on July 1.
 - > Dan T. will also explore options with the GHC Fairgrounds staff for short term storage.
