There is to be no coaching during riding classes.** Please let your riders prove they can do it on their own. 4-H promotes youth development. Adults are not allowed to assist 4-H riders except for safety reasons. Please ask the help of another 4-H member. The class announcements are a courtesy, and the rider is responsible to be in their correct class on time. No cross entry. This means if you are entered in Walk/Trot classes you must stay in Walk/Trot classes all day. This applies to 1<sup>st</sup> year classes, Alternate classes, and regular classes. If you tie your horse to your horse trailer, please clean up after it and fill in holes. There is to be **NO RIDING ON THE PAVEMENT.**
