4H Camp Financial Summary- Heather Doran Update: Net profit for camp was \$4,547.31 so now we need to figure out how to spend some money. Maybe a new game or a giant floating blob on the lake. Total in account is \$26,547.31 Summer Camp will be July 13-18th 2024. 25 kids received partial scholarships this past summer. Won't go above 100 spots so we want to make sure 4-H members in both counties are getting priority for these spots first before it opens up to everybody else.
