- 4. Treasurer's Report Michael
 - Checking account balance: \$72,048.70; Savings \$1.00; CDs \$18,329.98; TOTAL \$90,379.68
 - o Renewed CD that is due to renew in December; next CD is due to renew in March and that is in motion
 - one fine tuning in the financial summary the Early Learning Coalition we are managing this money for this group, but it is not 4-H funds; Financial summary now has a total at the bottom that indicates 4-H money; Dan shared that 4-H gets \$50/month to manage the Early Learning Coalition funds

- 5. Extension Updates Dan/Heather
 - Dan recommends that a financial subcommittee be established for the short term to combine some of the buckets within the budget to make it easier to spend and report on. The role would be to write up a paragraph for each bucket to know what can be spent appropriately. Dan offers to come with a consolidated list - for tracking. Who wants to be on the subcommittee: Dan & Marilyn
 - Heather: Look at the end of this month for a visual communication to share what 4-H is doing; Photos for "feel good Friday" post; Heather needs photos from clubs and project meetings
 - New Clubs:

A couple new clubs in Mason happening and another person expressed interest (4-H alumni) - exploring the options; each new club receives a club kit (potentially 3 new clubs this year)

Helping Scarlett - Pacific 4-H youth who lost her mom and brother in a car accident recently - council agreed via email to support Scarlet. Dan learned that Scarlet will be in a wheelchair for the next 6 months due to her injuries. Scarlet wants to get into woodworking as her new 4-H project. Dan requests funds to support this, including curriculum, woodworking tools (age appropriate), and some 4-H swag/clothing. Funds requested \$150 - Motion made by Jamie, 2nd by Mckenzie - motion carried. (Dan plans to get it taken care of by the end of the year)

- Thank you for the heater approved during the last meeting it was greatly appreciated during archery training 12/9
- Mason county budget passed at the county level with no adjustments; Grays Harbor budget is facing a
 10% reduction, but extension is not on the hook for the 10% at this time. Dan will keep us posted
- o In Mason County, there is a noxious weed position open currently please spread the word
- Club kit project is up and running; Dan and Heather will be teaching at the Alaska conference about the club kit
- Pacific county 4-H educator Toni Gwen is retiring at the end of 2023. The position will not be refilled by WSU so volunteers have been coming to Dan for direction. Recently he got approval for a part time person to support Pacific county. Dan was asked to take on Pacific county - this is still under review.

6. Committee Reports

o 4-H Camp - Jamie

December 29 is the orientation/ informational session for teen and adult volunteers Summer Teen Leaders will now include Counselors, Program Staff, and Kitchen staff - training monthly.

Adult volunteers are needed for classes, overnight chaperons, and kitchen help Ropes course is no longer- it will become a team building challenge course. All summer campers will get to experience the challenge course. (Work party will be organized at camp as a result of the logging effort at Panhandle.)

Fair

Gray Harbor volunteers, fair and livestock auction are very welcoming. Heather will be attending the next livestock auction meeting to get details and rules about how Mason County kids can begin to participate in the auction. This will be a soft launch this year and include parent involvement with the auction (no more than 10 families - no cloverbuds). There are already 70+ pigs! Mason families will need to commit to small animals. Important to keep in mind that the Youth Livestock Auction committee is it's own 501(3)c.

Still life barn - Mason representation was good this past year, let's keep it up!

Marilyn will be sitting on the Fair Committee from Mason Co.

Super Saturday - Marilyn

Heather, Jamie and Marilyn met last month about Super Saturday. Super Saturday is a workshop focused day for 4-H families and members.
