

Pend Oreille County 4-H Virtual Showcase 2020 Class Procedures

**DEPARTMENT B: SEWING/NEEDLE CRAFTS – DIRECT QUESTIONS TO SUPERINTENDENT HEIDI VAUGHN

General: Videos shall be performed with camera in the horizontal (landscape) position. Photos may be horizontal or vertical as best fits the subject matter. Complete an entry form with each emailed group of entries or with USB drive entries. Name the photo or video file with: Your exhibitor # - Class Number – and individual letter for each file. Example: if my exhibitor number is 356 and the class number is 5P and I have 4 photos for this entry, my files would be named: 356-5P-a, 356-5P-b, 356-5P-c, 356-5P-d. Please watch your videos all the way through before entering to ensure there are no errors in either the visual or audio.

CLASS 1P: NEEDLEWORK (UP TO 5 DISTINCT ENTRIES)

Take 1 to 3 photos of each entry as necessary to show the complete needlework.

CLASS 2P: SEWING (UP TO 5 DISTINCT ENTRIES)

Take 3 to 5 photos of each entry as necessary to show the complete sewing article. Photos shall be taken of the complete front, back and a closeup of the interior seams with stitching clearly visible.

CLASS 3V: FASHION REVUE (1 ENTRY)

- Videos must not be longer than 10 minutes. Any videos longer than 10 minutes will be disqualified.
- Begin video with introduction (name, age, 4H Club) then a description of the garment you have sewn and are wearing.
- In the video be sure to answer the following questions (in any order as part of your commentary) - ◇ Why did you choose this project? ◇ What type of fabric did you use? ◇ What was the hardest part of constructing your garment? ◇ What was the cost to make the garment? ◇ What would have been the cost if it had been purchased in a store? ◇ What new skill(s) did you learn?
- Model your garment moving in a traditional “T” pattern (walk front, slow full turn, walk to left, stop and turn to center of stage, walk to right, stop and turn to center of stage, walk to center, 180 turn hold momentarily, and then return to starting location making a final 180 turn to face the audience).
- Video ends with you thanking the judges for their time.
