

Pend Oreille County 4-H Virtual Showcase 2020 Class Procedures

DEPARTMENT I: GOATS & CAMELIDS – DIRECT QUESTIONS TO SUPERINTENDENT DIANE LUKAS 509-590-7468, dianelukas@rocketmail.com

General: Videos shall be performed with camera in the horizontal (landscape) position. Photos may be horizontal or vertical as best fits the subject matter. Complete an entry form with each emailed group of entries or with USB drive entries. Name the photo or video file with: Your exhibitor # - Class Number – and individual letter for each file. Example: if my exhibitor number is 356 and the class number is 5P and I have 4 photos for this entry, my files would be named: 356-5P-a, 356-5P-b, 356-5P-c, 356-5P-d. Please watch your videos all the way through before entering to ensure there are no errors in either the visual or audio.

CLASS 1V: FITTING AND SHOWING MANDATORY (1 ENTRY)

Complete a video with the following (show attire is recommended, but not required):

- Indicate your animal's name, breed, specify meat or dairy, gender and age.
- What is your favorite thing about your animal?
- Demonstrate how to lead and pose your animal.
- For Alpaca/camelid only: demonstrate your animal completing (3) obstacles.
- Intermediate showmen shall also indicate (2) facts about goats or alpacas or diseases and indicate (2) parts of the animal.
- Senior showmen shall also indicate (3) uncommon facts about goats or alpacas, (2) common parasites and (5) parts of your animal.

CLASS 2V: CONFORMATION (UP TO 2 ENTRIES PER BREED)

Complete a video that shows all sides of the animal. Show the cleanliness of the animal and show closeups of the legs, hooves, inside ears, eyes including famacha.

CLASS 3V: COSTUME (1 ENTRY)

Complete a video with an introduction of your costume and showing all sides of the costume. If appropriate, show the costume with animal in motion.

CLASS 4V: OBSTACLE COURSE (1 ENTRY)

Complete a video of your goat or alpaca doing the obstacle course. This is a timed entry and the stopwatch should be shown as you start your time and as you complete your course. Contact the superintendent for the pattern.
