DRIVER:

- Properly fitted ASTM/SEI approved helmet with strap engaged
- Access to conservative attire or proper riding attire: for complete list see page 1 of the 1995 Harness Driving Manual

WHIP:

- Required (no lounging type of whip)—whip must be long enough to reach the animals shoulder
- □ Whip is to be held at a 45 degree angle to ground and horse
- Demonstrate use of whip as an aid in place of use of seat and hands
- Demonstrate correct way of carrying when not in use

DRIVING:

Demonstrate the following gaits with control:

- Walk
- Slow trot/jog
- Working trot
- Strong trot
- Halt

RESOURCES:

- Back-up
- Circle to left and right—size appropriate to size of horse and vehicle
- 180 degree turn
- Reverse on the diagonal
- Demonstrates having the horse under control at all times
