

Clallam County 4-H Dog/Service Dog Projects

Enrollment/Animal Possession

- **4-H Members must be enrolled in the Dog or Service Dog by June 1st.**
- Dog projects are open to all age divisions including Cloverbuds.
- Rroject animals must be under the management and care of the 4-H member 60 days prior to fair.

Record Book

Complete a 4-H Record book with a separate project record section for the Dog project.

- Standard WSU Book: In place of the Journal, complete the Dog add sheet C0794E for each dog.
- Clallam County 4-H Record Book: Use one general project record for each project. Dog add sheet is optional, the skills checklist should be used as a tool for project meetings.

Breed/Health Requirements

- Any breed (purebred or mixed) is allowed. Dogs must be safely handled by the 4-H member. 4-H leaders reserve the right to disqualify any dog that is observed to be unfit for 4-H participation.
- Dogs must come with verification of the following vaccines: Distemper, Infectious Hepatitis, Parainfluenza, Parvo (DHPP), Kennel Cough, and Rabies. Recommended optional vaccinations: Leptospirosis. Corona.
- Rabies Vaccination certificate must come from veterinarian and include: Date of most recent vaccination, dog's name or ID and age, brand or type of vaccine, veterinarians' signature and license (no stamped signature).

County Fair Participation

- Enter animals using a Clallam County Fair Exhibitor's Guide and Entry Form turned into the Barn Superintendent on or before July Ist.
- Members may bring two dogs if member has been training both dogs. The only class that both dogs may enter is Obedience.
- **4-H** members must participate in Fitting and Showing.
- Dogs must be at least 6 months of age.
- **%** No Dogs in Season.
- Leaders and/or superintendents have the right to send dog home if dog's behavior is unacceptable (aggressive barking, etc.).

Customary Showing Attire

Suits, dresses, skirts, sports jacket, dress pants or casual slacks; dress shirt (sports or polo shirts, sweaters, or vests are recommended). Wear clothing that is neat, clean and professional. Dog showpeople typically wear clothing that is in contrasting color to their dog. Dress shoes are preferred but tennis shoes will be allowed. No open toed shoes.

County Medals

County medals are awarded based on a member's performance at fair. There is only one medal awarded per every ten members enrolled in each project area (Dog, Cat, etc.). Points are kept by barn superintendent.

Points are awarded in the following categories:

Point system:
5 pts for Champion
4 pts for Reserve
3 pts for Blue
2 pts for Red
I pt for White
