

## Recommended Planting Times and Vegetable Varieties for the North Olympic Peninsula

The following recommendations are based on experiences at Clallam County Master Gardener Demonstration Gardens. Performance of the recommended varieties and planting times can vary depending on specific garden conditions such as elevation, sun and wind exposure, and use of raised beds.

Suggested planting times are for planting outdoors without protection from cold. If plant covers are used (such as low tunnels or floating row covers), seeds and starts can sometimes be planted earlier than stated.

Planting starts (well-established seedlings), where appropriate, will usually provide a faster harvest. Not all vegetable types, however, transplant well. Starts are commonly used for Brassica family members (such as broccoli, cabbage, and cauliflower), eggplants, leeks, peppers, squash, and tomatoes.
