### **PROJECT INCOME OR LOSS**

If total income is less than total expenses, you have lost money on your project. Find the reason and make the necessary changes if you are keeping this project as a business. You must keep records to have a better idea of where the money comes from and what it is spent for. Your good animals will appear on the record sheet because of their value as breeders. Animals with poor records can be spotted and sold.

Use the expense and income columns of the previous page to list all purchases made or items sold. Record the items on the date you bought or sold. Include fair premiums as an income. When items are used at home, assign a fair market value for record purposes. A fair market value is what one would have to pay a competitor or a store to buy that product. Be fair and sensible; don't try to pad your records.
