

4-H WANTS YOU

What is 4-H?

- ◆ **4-H is a fun, practical, learn-by-doing educational program for youth.**
- ◆ **4-H develops life skills** by helping youth acquire self-discipline, confidence, and a sense of responsibility.
- ◆ **4-H builds citizenship** by providing youth with real-world experiences volunteering and taking action in their communities.
- ◆ **4-H promotes sportsmanship** by offering the opportunity to learn fair and ethical competition.
- ◆ **4-H opens doors to the future** by introducing 4-H youth to a variety of activities that can lead to a career.



What is Your Role?

Adult volunteers are needed to assist youth in developing their projects and life skills. Caring adults act as advisors, guides, and mentors. Share your skills and knowledge with young people today.



- ◆ As a **General Leader** you will assume the primary responsibility for a 4-H club. You will work with club officers and members as they conduct meetings, plan programs, coordinate events, and keep parents informed. Clubs meet at regular intervals under the guidance of the general leader.
- ◆ As a **Project Leader** you will work with the general club leader to organize, plan, and conduct project meetings using your expertise to lead a specific project.
- ◆ As an **Activity Leader** you will provide short-term leadership for an activity at the club and/or county level. Activity volunteers include presenters, judges, chaperones, drivers, and anyone that may be unsupervised around youth.

Who oversees 4-H?

4-H is the youth development program administered by the USDA & the Land Grant University in each state.

Washington State University Extension is the governing body in Washington State. The organization and management of 4-H Youth Development is a partnership between Extension personnel, Walla Walla County staff, and volunteers.

What is required to apply?

All program volunteers must pass a Washington State Patrol (WSP) background check. Out-of-State or recently relocated volunteers may require a national background check.
