



4-H Teen Leadership Year Pin Application



Application is due to the Extension office by 5pm on the first business day of October.

Note: The 4-H Teen Leadership Year Pin is different from the 4-H Leadership Project Medal of Honor.

The Teen Leadership Year Pin is given to members **in the 6th – 12th grade** who, during the current 4-H year, have completed the 4-H leadership project based on the requirements listed below. To receive a Teen Leadership Year Pin the member must adequately complete this application with signatures and meet all the listed requirements.

The Leadership Project Medal of Honor requires the member to submit a completed record book (with a Leadership project section: pages 7-14) and a Project Medal of Honor Application to the Extension office by the first business day of October.

The member must be in **the 6th – 12th grade** have given a demonstration (listed in their record book) and receive a leadership record book score of 80% or better.

Leadership is continuously inspiring others to work toward a common goal. It is a way of thinking and a way of acting. The 4-H Teen Leadership Project is an opportunity for teens to develop and practice their leadership skills. Who can be a teen leader? A teen leader is a 4-H member who is in the 6th – 12th grade and has been enrolled in the 4-H leadership project by their club leader. The main responsibility is to assist the adult leaders with a 4-H club or special program. To enhance their leadership skills teens are encouraged to be involved in planning county 4-H events and actively participate in District and State 4-H activities.

To complete this project and receive a leadership pin you are expected to fulfill the following requirements during the current 4-H year (October 1 to September 30). Add additional pages as needed for descriptions. *A family club should contact the Extension office for modified requirements.*
