



SNAP-Ed Nutrition Educator
Benton Franklin WSU Extension

Washington State University Extension's SNAP-Ed program teaches youth and adults with limited incomes to develop skills and behaviors to make healthy choices. SNAP-Ed is funded through a federal grant from the USDA's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Nutrition Educators deliver nutrition education through class series and one-time events to participants between the ages of older elementary youth through to seniors.

In Benton Franklin, WSU SNAP-Ed goes into elementary schools, middle schools, high schools, food banks & pantries, farmers markets, housing sites, and CSO's.

Hours vary, but typically range between 10-18 hours per week and will fluctuate based on program needs. Most programming takes place during school hours; however, occasional evenings will be available. Pay rate is \$16.00 per hour. Please note that positions are temporary appointments until September 30, 2019; appointment thereafter is contingent on funding and performance.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Providing nutrition education at qualified local sites using USDA evidence-based curriculum
- Purchasing groceries and prepping demonstration food for lessons
- Providing support to qualified sites to improve policies, systems and environments with the aim of promoting nutrition/physical activity
- Completing any necessary reports and/or records to monitor program participants
