



Explore 4-H Bingo Rules

What's your talent? Before you answer, we all have them. Talent is not just how well we can perform on the stage, it is the skills we possess that help us at school, in our jobs and as a member of a team. So before answering... "I don't have a talent", think about what you are good at. Now think of all the things you have not tried. Are you good at them?

Over the next five weeks, I will send out a project Monday through Friday related to the 4-H project area. This is the perfect opportunity to explore your talents. While you may not be the best at something, do you have a passion for it? Skills can be taught, passion is generated. If you chose to play Explore 4-H bingo, you will learn about your passions as well as you explore what 4-H has to offer. Remember this is a time to explore YOU!

Rules for "Explore 4-H Bingo"

1. Once a project is completed take a picture. You may be asked to share it with others.
2. Show your completed work to an adult and have them initial one of the boxes with the project topic in it. You will notice while making your bingo board, some of the project areas are duplicated. It is your choice as to which box that is signed off. But remember only one box can be marked off for each project.
3. Projects can be done and signed off at any time over the next five weeks. Remember you will receive one each day (Monday-Friday) for a total of 25 projects. Project directions will be located on the Walla Walla County 4-H web page at....
4. Use a project notebook to record thoughts, problems, potential solutions, and other ideas. Each activity will come with a few additional questions. Your project notebook a great place to record their answers or to formulate new ideas.
5. Be creative and add your own flair to the projects. Modify, decorate, and make it your own. The directions are there as a guide, not as rules.
6. Prizes will be awarded for the first and second bingo, and for a full black out (completion of all 25 projects).
7. The last project day will be Friday, August 14th.
8. Pictures of your bingo boards will need to be submitted to Melanie at mowens@wsu.edu by Monday, August 17th, 2020.
9. Projects completed during "Explore 4-H Bingo" may be submitted to the virtual showcase. Directions will follow for the showcase.
10. Additional awards may be awarded for most creative, best modifications, etc. during the showcase.
