

Coffee Filter Flowers

Fresh Flowers can add a pop of color to any room in a moment's notice but after a few days they can begin to wilt and wither. Fake flowers are a nice alterative, but they can be expensive, and you limited to someone else's design. What is the solution? Make your own!

<u>Objective</u>: Learn how to make a beautiful flower arrangement using household items. Explore how color are is added to fresh cut flowers and how flowers in nature can be influenced by their environment.

Ages: 1st-12th Grade

Time: 1 hour-2 hours

Supplies:

- 1-5 Coffee filters
- Scissors
- Food coloring, markers or other water-soluble colors
- Pipe cleaner(s)
- Wax paper or newspaper
- Spray bottle
- Dropper or spoon

Activity Directions:

- 1. Take one coffee filter and fold it in half four times creating a wedge shape.
- 2. Using the scissors round the straight edge of the wedge creating a single flower pedal shape.
- 3. Open the coffee filter up. Optional: To make the flower petals fan out, cut straight down an inch from the edge on the creases made from folding the coffee filter.
- 4. Place the coffee filter flower on a sheet of wax paper or several layers of newspaper.
- 5. Color the flowers by using washable colors (markers, colored pencils, etc.) or food coloring.
 - <u>Food coloring:</u> Add a few drops of food coloring to one tablespoon of water in a small bowl. Spray the flower with a little bit of water. Using a spoon, put little drops of the food coloring mixture on the flower.
 - <u>Washable colors</u>: Draw a design on the coffee filter using washable colors. Spray the flower shapes with a little water. (Do not use too much or the color will run off.)
- 6. Let the flowers dry completely on the wax paper (or newspaper).
- 7. Once the flower is dry, pinch the center of the flower to bring the petals together. Wrap one end of a pipe cleaner tightly around the base of the flower and form a stem with the rest.
- 8. Join two or more flowers together to create a fuller flower or even a bouquet

Facilitation Questions:

- What patterns and colors would can you create when making these flowers?
- Did you create a new color by adding different colors together? What it expected or unexpected?
- How do you think a coffee filter mimics how plants use water?
- How do you think adding colored to water to plants might influence the coloring?
- What jobs are associated with making decorations by utilizing flowers of various types (real and fake)?
