The 4-H Camp program is still working on opening a checking account.

The Council has several vacant spots to fill.

Committee and Project Reports

Awards- Awards forms are now online. The deadline for record books and forms to be turned into the 4-H Office is 10/10. There’s a new award sponsored by the farm bureau.

Camp Program- Applications are available for TC’s and CIT’s for the upcoming camp. Interviews will be held 9/30 and 10/1. There were 4 requests for refunds from donors to camp. The amount returned is \$6.135.

Clover Academy- Someone is needed to take over for next year. There was discussion on a possible name change as many equate Clover Academy with Cloverbuds and assume it’s an event for Cloverbuds alone.

Dog- 11 youth qualified for state fair with their dogs, 10 for judging, and 2 fo agility.

Equine- Several youth qualified but the teams are not quite full. Record books and posters were entered at county fair. The WSU specialist came and inspected the arena and offered suggestions on how to make the arena rideable. Until we talk to the county, we are not allowed to go rake out the large rocks.

Fair- Superintendents are asked to turn in their choices for each project’s Superintendent Award.

Fundraising- The Council still has some “100 years of 4-H” pins available for sale.

Market Auction- Steers need to be purchased by 1/1. There were only 2 4-H youth this year. The USDA offers scholarships to kids who may want to try a large animal project. Scholarships were given out to Michaela Buyer, Dylan Leer and 2 FFA youth.

Outreach- Welcome to 4-H Night will be held 10/25 from 6-7:30PM at Silver Ridge Elementary School. Each club is encouraged to attend.

Public Presentations- Contact Bruce Bradley to arrange public presentations at state fair.

Shooting Sports- 41 youth attended county fair. Of those, 12 went on to state. They excelled at knowledge and judging. There were a few issues with the lights during shooting and also with the campgrounds/dorms.

Old Business

New Business

Brian Brandt presented a budget for the 2017-18 year. There is currently a \$5,000 surplus in the General Fund. Brian Brandt suggested rolling over \$2,975 from the surplus to cover the \$5 fee the Council has been charging youth each year. Nanette Seevers moved to approve the budget. Corrina Coan seconded the motion. Motion passed on a voice vote.

Representatives for Forum were selected. Kevin Buyer, Becky Kahlvik, Corrina Coan and Wanda Meeker. Brian Brandt moved to approve the delegates. Aaron Stahowiak seconded the motion. Motion carried on a voice vote. \$900 has been budgeted to pay for registration along with \$400 to pay for up to half of each delegate's expenses with receipts.
