She is a senior Environmental Health Specialist with the Water Pollution Identification and Correction Program (PIC) at Kitsap Public Health District with 21 years of experience conducting pollution identification and correction projects. Her efforts in Port Gamble Bay and Burley Lagoon resulted in fecal coliform pollution source corrections that led to the upgrade of commercial shellfish growing areas.
