



4-H HORSE LEADERS' SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

This award is for \$200 and is open to currently enrolled 4-H Equine Project members only. It is open to any field of study at a 2- or a 4-year college or vocational/technical school. Up to two (2) scholarships may be awarded. The typical applicant would be a recent high school graduate, beginning post-high-school education, but might also include high school student in Running Start, using scholarship to pay for books.

Alternates will be chosen if the applicant is unable to attend school. Applications must be submitted by the Awards Application due date and will be awarded at the 4-H Recognition Program. The certificate will be awarded at the program. The check will be issued when school starts, or thereafter when information is supplied by the winner(s).

Applicant must be a senior 4-H member and have completed at least 4 years in a 4-H equine project by the time of application. Minimum grade point average (G.P.A.) is 2.0.

This entry has six (6) components:

- 1) A signed and completed Kitsap County 4-H Awards Entry Form
 - 2) Addendum for Scoring Horse Awards
 - 3) An up-to-date 4-H record Book for the year just completed is required to be submitted for county year-end judging.
 - 4) A sealed transcript from school, or in the case of home schooling, a parent transcript showing high school courses and grades.
 - 5) An essay (length determined by applicant) outlining the applicant's plans for school, discussing chosen field of study and how further education will support career plans.
 - 6) Two sealed letters of recommendation. One should be from a club leader or project leader, (not a parent if a parent is the leader) and one from another unrelated individual (example, teacher, pastor, etc.).
