Kitsap County 4-H Awards Information

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR YEAR END AWARDS

- Youth must be an enrolled member of Kitsap County 4-H and in good standing
- Youth must be enrolled in the proper projects to apply for award in that project.
- Youth must complete all award forms and submit by due date.

TO APPLY FOR YEAR END AWARDS

- Submit Record Book for judging in August, prior to fair. Record Books do not have to be updated after the August county wide Record Book judging; however, detailed entries through September 30th help increase the members' score and chance of receiving an award.
- Judges will look for detailed entries in the member's Record Book. Judges do not contact members asking for missing information.
- Determine which awards you are eligible for.
- Complete the Awards Cover Sheet. Be sure to put a checkmark to the right of each award that is submitted. This allow the judge to know how many awards the member is applying.
- Print the specific award forms and fill them out (found on Kitsap County 4-H website). Be sure
 to include current contact information on each form so invitations to Year End Awards
 Recognition Night can be mailed to award recipients.
- All forms need to be clipped together go in the front left pocket of the member's record book.
 This helps the judge know if he/she has all of your award applications and helps lesson the chance of forms getting lost.

PURPOSE OF YEAR END AWARDS

Year End Awards are designed to honor members by recognizing member's growth, achievements, accomplishments, and participation in their project(s). Judges will look at the member's application forms, nomination forms, leader recommendations and information documented in the member's Record Book when selecting award recipients.

LEADERS/VOLUNTEERS

- Any <u>club</u> or <u>project</u> leader may nominate any member for any award. The member does <u>not</u> <u>need to be in the same club</u> as the leader making the nomination.
- Complete the nomination form and submit it with the Record Book to the judges for review.

SPONSORED AWARDS

Members may apply for as many of the SPONSORED AWARDS as they qualify for. Make sure the member's record book has details to support achievements during the most recent 4-H year. Complete application form and attach to Awards Cover Sheet.

NOMINATED AWARDS

Members are nominated for these awards by club and/or project leaders. Nomination forms are submitted to judges by nominee. Record Books must have been judged to receive a nominated award.

RECOGNITION AWARDS

TWO NEW AWARDS THIS YEAR! Members may apply or be nominated for as many Recognition Awards as applicable. The judging committee will review all entries. Many of these awards do not require a specific Record Book tab but do require your Record Book being judged (Leadership Award requires a Leadership Tab). Make sure to reflect all award criteria in your Record Book through the Calendar, Activity Log, Permanent Record, and all other pertinent areas.

My 4-H Story and Spirit of 4-H Award do not require a Record Book to be judged in order to apply or receive either awards.

PROJECT RECOGNITION AWARDS

Propose for Award: Honor members by recognizing members' growth, achievements, and participation in project(s).

Award: Junior will be awarded a certificate for each Project Recognition Award they earn. Intermediates and Seniors will be awarded a project pin and certificate for each Project Recognition Award they earn.

- Members may apply or be nominated for as many Project Recognition Awards as applicable. The judging committee will review all entries.
- Members can earn up to FOUR awards from the projects listed under Project Recognition.
- Member must be enrolled in the project and have a record book tab for each project recognition is sought.
- Include a nomination / application form for <u>EACH</u> project a Project Recognition Award is being sought.
- Any club or project leader may nominate any member for Project Recognition Awards.
- Record books need to be submitted with all the awards being applied or nominated for. Place
 the Awards Cover Sheet and all award forms in the front left pocket of the member's record
 book.

TRACY SUE PARKER MEMORIAL AWARD

This award is designed to recognize and reward youth for efforts that create positive benefits in their community. This award goes to a club. The club that wins the Tracy Sue Parker Award will receive a monetary award from the Memorial Fund. The award application is on the Kitsap County 4-H website.

WILLIAM R. GREAVES MEMORIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

This award is awarded to the youth in Kitsap County that was the most outstanding with all around 4-H achievement.

Judges look at all applications forms from member for awards being sought. Judges will also look at all information documented in the Record Book.
