Treasure report was read by Bruce Bradley, Treasurer. Beginning balance was 35,595.19 with an income of \$0.62 in dividend and \$176.20 from the Kitsap Community Foundation (Kitsap Great Give) for a total income of \$176.82. There were no expenses for this month. The balance as of June 30 is \$35,772.01 which is broken down into \$10,768.87 in checking, \$25,003.14 in savings. The investment account has \$37,314.60 in the Keith Berkenfield Scholarship Fund, \$9,440.37 in the Kitsap County 4-H Council Fund, \$14,741.37 in the Kitsap Summer Camp fund for a total of \$61,496.34 with a market loss of \$3,935.46.

Committee and Project reports:

- Awards- Janet is still at the country club and they are happy to have us back at the same time and date, Friday November 11th. We are waiting on the contract. Awards night can be a potluck style if someone wants to organize the event. If not, it will be a shorter event.
- Camp- Enrollment numbers are down. Camp will still be held but funds will be in the red and will use scholarships more. A camp nurse and adult volunteers.
- Record Books- Educational displays and record book turn-in for fair is one week earlier than usual. Turn in will be on Friday, August 12th from 12-7pm at the Pavilion. Please let your club members know.
- Dogs- Two 4-H clubs will be at fair. Open class will also be available and will be continuing from now on due to low 4-H numbers.
- Equine- Going well, will be combining open class and minis at fair to have larger numbers due to low numbers. Heritage had fundraiser and Blazing Saddles is going to have a poster making party. Not doing a lot of ride meetings. Pre-fair will also be combined.
- Llamas- Bare bones club and not much going on. Has some outings and hikes planned for summer. Will have a few people at fair.

On Wednesdays from 10-noon at Blueberry Park in Bremerton will also be planting lettuce and this event is open to everyone.
- Sewing- Have a few projects for fair and is looking for a superintendent.
