The investment account has \$38,842.24 in the Keith Berkenfield Scholarship Fund, \$9,989.97 in the Kitsap County 4-H Council Fund, \$15,599.59 in the Kitsap Summer Camp fund for a total of \$65,431.80 with a market gain of \$1,413.33. Becky Kalvik motioned to accept the treasures report, Gavin Kavanaugh seconded, the treasurers report was accepted.
