Treasure report was read by Bruce Bradley, Treasurer. Beginning balance was \$35,064.25 with an income of \$1,309.28. Expenses for January and February were \$452 for equine leaders, \$355 for teen account, \$350.36 for 4-H Academy and \$10 for State nonprofit filing. The balance as of January 31st is \$35,206.17 which is broken down into \$11,464.95 in checking, \$25,008.58 in savings with a difference of \$1,267.36 for 4 \$25 awards checks and \$1,167.36 for December expenses. The investment account has \$37945.08 in the Keith Berkenfield Scholarship Fund, \$9,870.78 in the Kitsap County 4-H Council Fund, \$15,413.48 in the Kitsap Summer Camp fund for a total of \$64,729.34.

- By-Laws- Chuck will send out revisions to vote on next month. Send corrections to Chuck/Wanda.
- 4-H Academy-had 28 classes, 106 people attended including parents, 12 no shows, 90 slices of pizza served, 23 teachers, and Marcus brought a 4-H clover made from 107 mini Rubix cubes.
