Youth, ages 8 to 19, learn to place four individual horses by comparing them to the accepted standard. Older youth are expected to be able to give their reasons for the placings. The process teaches the importance of standards, how to make choices, and how to justify those choices. <i>ALL DAY event.</i></p> <p>Grant County Sheriff's K9 Demonstration: K9 Endo and his handler, Deputy Tyson Voss will give you a first-hand look at the amazing work the deputy K9s do for our safety.</p> <p>Electrical Safety: Grant County PUD will have an on-site safety demonstration using a utility pole, electrical lines, and more! Something everyone should be aware of. They will demonstrate all day long.</p>
11:00	<p>Introduction to Theater/Acting: Join us for some fun improvisation exercises and learn some techniques and basics to help you get started in stage acting! All ages are welcome.</p> <p>Record Keeping – it's easier that you think! Shelley Wade, 4-H Leader of the 89er's club and her daughters, Tressa & Elisha, have been keeping exceptional 4-H record books for years! Come and find out how they do it.</p> <p>What can you do with foods in 4-H? There are many food activities and projects that members can do for fair and at fair! This is only an introductory training as to how, when, why YQCA is important in the raising and care of livestock.</p> <p>Final Drive Swine Showmanship Clinic: Back by popular demand! Blaine Lee, former 4-H and FFA Champion Swine Showman will give an interactive presentation to prepare newer and seasoned 4-H members for that Final Drive!
