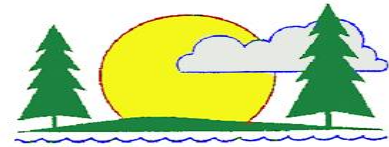

Good morning!

As we prepare for the NEW and improved **Washington State 4-H Livestock Judging Contest** scheduled for **June 25th in Moses Lake**, I wanted to reach out to those Clubs who have shown a strong interest in Livestock Judging in the past. Counties have the opportunity to enter as many teams/kids as they wish. There are NO pre-qualifying contests for this event. Teams will consist of four members. Seniors, Intermediates, and Juniors must judge within their perspective age group (age determined by the age of the member on October 1st, 2021). Any additional participants may judge as alternates. ALL kids will judge 8 classes of Breeding or Market: Beef, Sheep, Swine, and Meat Goats. Seniors will give 4 sets of Reasons, Intermediates, 2 sets of Reasons and 2 Questions classes, and Juniors, 1 set of Reasons with 1 Questions class.

This is set to be a much-improved contest with sponsors and an awards ceremony to follow with rosettes being awarded to overall high teams, overall high individuals, overall high team Reasons, overall high individual Reasons, top team for each species, and top individuals for each species. The top three teams will have the opportunity to participate in one of three national contests held in Louisville, Kansas City (Fall 2022) or Denver (Winter 2023).



My thought is to have each Club choose their own teams. If a Club does not have enough members to fill a particular division (Senior, Intermediate, Junior) they can combine individuals from other Clubs in either Lincoln or Adams Counties. This should allow for a more cohesive mix of kids and make it easier to practice prior to the contest. Also take note, that there will be a contest at the Spokane Junior Livestock Show, May 4th. This contest will be a great opportunity to determine the true interest of your kids and prepare for the State Contest in June.

As we get closer to June, we will send out a registration form for you to designate your team members and/or alternates. REMEMBER: all 4-H kids must be official members determined by enrollment on 4H Online. Julie, Dawn, and I will be checking this list closely, so make sure your kids are enrolled and approved.

Information for Volunteers and 4-H Club Volunteer Leaders

4-H Online 2.0 Enrollment: Start of the New 4-H Enrollment Year is October 1 thru July 31. The 4-H year begins October 1 and ends September 30. Youth who have reached their 5th birthday before October 1 of the current 4-H year through youth who have not reached their 19th birthday before October 1 of the current 4-H year are eligible to enroll in a 4-H club. Enroll in 4-H using the <https://v2.4honline.com>. Please use Google Chrome or Firefox Web Browser for best result.

Report Your Volunteer Hours Each Month

Volunteer hours are due each year by October 1. If you are a volunteer leader, you need to log your volunteer hours at <https://volunteers.cahnrs.wsu.edu/logon.aspx>. Your user's name will be either your last name only or your first & last name with a space in between. The password is password! (Don't forget the exclamation point). If you are unable to log in to the volunteer database, or if you have questions, please call the Extension office. You CAN – and if possible, please do, put in your volunteer hours retroactively.

2022 Lincoln Adams Certified Volunteer Training As we begin the 2022 year it is timely for each Club to think about the addition of NEW Adult Volunteers. As current Volunteers that are in leadership roles with your Clubs, you can share this message to those qualified adults that may wish to serve as Certified Adult Volunteers and/or Project Leaders.

Please help identify and forward this email to those individuals in your community. The information below is an outline of the process. The **NEW** certification steps follow an Online approach.

To begin the certification process, complete the Volunteer Application (Parts A and B) and required Volunteer Reference Forms and submit to Julie Hartz julie.hartz@wsu.edu Office: (509) 659-3209.

In addition, applicants must meet the WSU Extension COVID-19 Vaccination Mandate requirement (or approved Religious or Medical Exemption) AND pass the Sterling Volunteer Background check. Those individuals that need assistance in completing the course can contact Julie.

Washington State 4-H Food Preservation Training

WSU Extension has a new online food preservation program. "Washington State 4-H Food Preservation Training" is a series of five online lessons for 4-H project leaders leading Food Preservation curriculum and activities. All 4-H Project Leaders leading Food Preservation projects and activities will need to have completed this training series to enroll.

The training series emphasizes best practices for food preservation and safety. It is designed for beginning and veteran canners who want to update their knowledge and skills. The lessons provide the most current USDA-approved food preservation recommendations. Topics include food safety, the basics of canning and information on specific food preservation methods, including pressure canning and boiling water bath canning, as well as making fruit spreads and pickled foods. A certificate of completion is provided at the end of the course.
