4-H is so excited to use the GivePulse software program for tracking volunteer hours!

TIPS: The main thing for the leaders to do is to sign up and when they want to report any hours, the word in the system is not hours but "impact." They "add an impact."

On the initial sign-up page, it immediately asks for a WSU email...this throws everyone off because most of our volunteers do not have a WSU email...however, there is a spot for non-WSU email folks to sign up (just under where it asks for a WSU address). This part is a common spot where people get nervous and freeze up. So, if you can get past that point, then you are good to go. They also need to remember that "impacts" is the term for hours.

Give Pulse

- Begin logging "Impact Hours" AKA Volunteer Hours
 - 1) Add Impact
- Enter time and event that took place
 - 2) Register for Programed Event and claim hours

Information for Volunteers and 4-H Club Volunteer Leaders

4-H Online 2.0 Enrollment: Start of the New 4-H Enrollment Year is October 1 thru July 31.

The 4-H year begins October 1 and ends September 30. Youth who have reached their 5th birthday before October 1 of the current 4-H year through youth who have not reached their 19th birthday before October 1 of the current 4-H year are eligible to enroll in a 4-H club.
