



HUMMINGBIRD FRIENDLY PLANT LIST

Some recommended plants for the Inland Northwest (with blooming season)

- Beardtongue (*Penstemon spp.*) late spring to summer
- Blazing star or gayfeather (*Liatris spp.*) mid-summer to fall
- Bleeding heart (*Dicentra spp.*) late spring to summer
- Columbine (*Aquilegia spp.*) spring to early summer
- Coral bells (*Heuchera spp.*) spring to summer
- Daylilies (*Hemerocallis spp.*) summer
- Foxglove (*Digitalis spp.*) late spring to summer
- Hyssop or hummingbird mint (*Agastache spp.*) mid-summer to fall
- Cardinal flower (*Lobelia cardinalis*), and other *Lobelia spp.* summer to early fall
- Larkspur (*Delphinium spp.*) spring to summer
- Golden currant (*Ribes aureum*) spring
- Honeysuckle (*Lonicera spp.*) summer to fall
- Hummingbird trumpet (*Zauschneria californica*) late summer
- Lupine (*Lupinus spp.*) early spring to early summer
- *Phlox spp.* varies with variety: spring to early fall
- Red birds in a tree (*Scrophularia spp.*) summer
- Royal catchfly (*Silene spp.*) late spring to summer
- Sage (*Salvia spp.*) early summer to late fall
- Solomon's seal (*Polygonatum spp.*) spring
