REMOVE ALL FLOWER STALKS AND DEAD LEAVES FROM THESE PERENNIALS, BUT LEAVE FOLIAGE AT THE BASE:

<i>Aquilegia*</i>	Columbine
<i>Artemesia</i>	Mugworts (cut 6-12" in Spring)

<i>Campanula</i>	Bellflower
<i>Cerastium tomentosum*</i>	Snow in Summer
<i>Chrysanthemum</i>	Chrysanthemum (fall or spring)
<i>Coreopsis</i>	Tickseed
<i>Digitalis</i>	Foxglove
<i>Echinops</i>	Globe Thistle
<i>Erigeron</i>	Fleabane (reduce ½ in spring)

<i>Doronicum</i>	Leopard's Bane
<i>Eupatorium</i>	Joe Pye Weed
<i>Gaillardia</i>	Blanket Flower

<i>Geum</i>	Geum (remove dead leaves regularly)
<i>Gypsophila</i>	Baby's Breath
<i>Lathyrus</i>	Sweet Pea
<i>Liatrus</i>	Gayfeather
<i>Linum perenne</i>	(Perennial Flax)
<i>Lupinus</i>	Lupine
<i>Paeonia</i>	Peony (cut to 1-2 inches when dormant)
<i>Physostegia virginiana</i>	Obedient Plant, False Dragonhead
<i>Polemonium caeruleum</i>	Jacobs Ladder
<i>Rudbeckia L.</i>	Black-eyed Susan, Cutback Coneflower
<i>Thermopsis</i>	Carolina Lupine
<i>Trollius</i>	Globeflower (Cut back when blooming stops)

***PERENNIALS TO LEAVE STANDING FOR WINTER INTEREST (cut back in spring):**

<i>Armeria</i>	Lady's Cushion", Thrift, or Sea Pink

<i>Ferns</i>	Ferns
<i>Gallium odoratum</i>	Sweet Woodruff
<i>Hedera</i>	English Ivy
