CLARK COUNTY 4-H LEADERS' ASSOCIATION

This scholarship is available to 4-H members who will graduate from high school at the end of the current school year and to former 4-H members from Clark County who are currently pursuing or plan to pursue higher education next year. They may attend community colleges, four-year colleges/universities, or vocational training programs as undergraduates.

The required pages must be completed, arranged and stapled in the following order* :

1. Cover sheet
2. 4-H Involvement Sheet(s)
3. 4-H Story
4. Community Involvement Sheet
5. Goals and Plans
6. Estimated Expense Sheet
7. 2 letters of recommendation:
 - a. 4-H volunteer involved with applicant through club or projects
 - b. An adult of your choice
8. Current transcripts of all years in high school through last semester completed (home schooled include topics studied with grades and required yearly test scores; private academies include transcripts). If applicable, include Clark College Running Start transcript with grades through last term completed. Applicants from other post high schools include the former transcripts and one for the last term completed at current school.

* No notebooks, binders, folders, dividers, etc. – just this form. Use of these will result in loss of points.

ALL 8 SECTIONS MUST BE INCLUDED IN THE APPLICATION TO BE CONSIDERED

Judging Criteria:

- **35% - 4-H Involvement/Story** - Number of projects, length and depth of involvement, growth, leadership, community service, and comprehensive 4-H story
- **25% Community Involvement** – Variety and depth of school and community projects, activities, exhibits, leadership and recognition
- **15% Goals and Plans** – 4-H influence on school and career goals; future plans
- **15% Academic** – Appropriate course loads and G.P.A. for future plans
- **10% Financial** – Realistic expenses

Award:

“The goal of the Scholarship Committee is to award approximately \$1200 annually. It may typically be two \$600 awards, based on the qualifications and number of applicants.”

By accepting an award, recipient agrees to help during current year with fund raising for the Clark County 4-H scholarship fund. Clark County 4-H Leaders Association Board and the Scholarship chairperson will determine what form: working at the county fair raffle booth, obtaining raffle donations, or other means to help perpetuate the fund. Arrangements will be made with the Scholarship chairperson. Failure to complete this obligation will result in forfeiture of one’s scholarship.

Scholarship checks will be issued to recipient’s community college, four year college/university, or vocational training program once the following information is received by the Clark County 4-H Scholarship Committee.


STUDENT’S RESPONSIBILITY: *Highly Important to follow steps below in a timely manner for your scholarship funds to be paid.*

2. Student name and ID number must be part of this confirmation.

3. Please include the school department and address as to where to send the scholarship monies.

4. Arrangements must be made for the dispersal of the funds no later than December 8, 2019 or the funds revert to the 4-H general scholarship fund.

4-H STORY



Write your 4-H story using the following guidelines:

- Introduce yourself. Tell about yourself, your age, interests, parents and siblings, where you live and go to school, and why you joined 4-H.
- Tell about the major project(s) or activity in which you are enrolled; why you chose the project(s); what goals you set and which ones did you reach; what you have learned in the project(s); describe the things you have tried and found successful and some that were not so successful; how you have paid for your project(s); and indicate profits, losses and savings.
- Give information about other projects and activities you have participated in; include major learning experiences, special interests, and unusual situations that you have experienced.
- Describe the most important offices you may have held and the committee assignments and leadership responsibilities you have accepted; tell about what you have learned from working with other 4-Hers in leadership roles; explain how you learned to accept citizenship responsibilities.

Limit your 4-H story to six pages. Include NO additional pages, letters, certificates, etc. Put all you need to say in the six pages.



GOALS AND PLANS

In no more than one page, describe how your 4-H participation has influenced your school and career goals; tell about your plans for the future and the career you would like to pursue.
