

2020 Clark County Horse 4-H Virtual Show

Entry Rules and Information

ENTRIES:

- Exhibitors must print out and mail their entry forms and payment to:

- Please make checks payable to: **Clark County 4-H Horse Leaders**
- All **entries must be postmarked no later than July 27th** to be eligible to participate in the Clark County Horse 4-H Virtual Show. **No late entries will be accepted.**
- After your entry forms and fees are processed, you will receive a confirmation email with your exhibitor number, registered class list, and a link to the form to use to submit your videos for judging.
- Show Patterns will be released via email and Facebook the morning of August 1st.
- You must include a YouTube link to the video of the class(s) you are entering using the online video submission form **no later than 11:59pm on August 15th**. **No late videos will be accepted.**

EXHIBITOR RULES:

- The Clark County Horse 4-H Virtual Show is open only to 4-H members in Clark County & Klickitat County, WA that are currently enrolled in the 4-H Horse Project.
- Every horse/rider combination **MUST** do a Fitting & Showing Class in order to participate in **any** of the other classes.
- All 4-H Rules apply to the 4-H Virtual Horse Showcase. Please consult the 4-H Horse Project and the PNW Horse Contest Guide for details.
- Show attire as well as safe and 4-H approved tack must be used and be appropriate for the class entered. Please consult the PNW Horse Contest Guide for details.
- Helmets or Western Hats are required for Showmanship classes. Helmets are required in all other classes.
- Exhibitors are encouraged to use a safe, level-footed area for their riding and in-hand classes. This does not have to be an arena. It can be a pasture area or yard provided the location is large enough to safely complete the required pattern.
- In setting up class Patterns; any visual marker—such as a small bucket, large upside-down cup, coffee-can, spray bottle, etc. can be substituted for the cones if cones are unavailable.
- For trail and mini/pony classes; lead ropes, foam pool noodles from the dollar store, etc. can be used in the place of ground poles or jump poles if ground poles are unavailable. Be sure that whatever you use will not break or cause harm to the horse if it is stepped on.

RESULTS & PLACINGS:

- The Danish system will be used for scoring: BLUE: 85-100 RED: 70-84 WHITE: 0-69
- Flat ribbons will be awarded based on the exhibitor's class score.
Rosettes will be awarded to 1st through 5th Place in each class.
- Cloverbuds will receive participation ribbons for classes entered.
- Results will be posted online on the Clark County 4-H Horse Project Facebook page & emailed to the exhibitor no later than August 22nd.
- Exhibitors' score sheets and feedback will be mailed to all participants along with their awarded ribbons no later than September 5th.

HOW TO RECORD YOUR VIDEO:

- Video recordings must only show ONE horse and rider combination completing the class pattern.
- Showmanship videos should be around 2 minutes or less, patterned riding classes may be 3 to 4 minutes in length, Dressage tests will take around 8 minutes or less. Videos for classes that are longer than the suggested times above will be penalized.
- **When recording, the sound must be on at all times. No one is allowed to coach or talk to the rider while they are completing their pattern. If coaching is heard on the audio, **the entry will be disqualified**. There also must be no music incorporated into the video or played in the background.**
- **No video editing** is allowed. If a video is suspected of being edited, **the entry will be disqualified**.
- If you are able to, mount the camera on a tripod to keep the camera steady.
- Please note that the location of where the videographer is to stand for the filming of each class is marked on each pattern by a small video camera symbol or will be located in the center of the circle or arena for rail classes. Dressage Test classes should be filmed from outside the arena area at "C".
- Avoid zooming in or out if possible. Some zooming may be required when the horse and rider/handler are at a far end of the arena.
- **If you are using a mobile device to video, please ensure that you are filming in Landscape or HORIZONTAL FORMAT** (the video screen should be wider than it is tall).
- Please be mindful of the lighting and the shadows as this could affect the clarity of your video.
- Review your video before submitting it to ensure that it is complete and that it is the correct video for the class # that it is labeled for.
- **All video entries MUST be submitted by 11:59pm on August 15th. No late videos will be accepted.**

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR VIDEOS:

- Create a YouTube Channel to upload your videos to.
- For How-to Info on how to upload a video to YouTube, please follow the link:

- Be sure to **save each video as "UNLISTED"** in the privacy settings—this will allow you to share your video link with the judge but will prevent the public from having access.
- Name each video you upload as follows:
 - Exhibitor #, Class # and Class name.
 - If you enter several Classes that have the same pattern, the same video can be submitted. Be sure when you upload those videos that you label them with all of the Class numbers you would like to enter it under. For example:
 - Exhibitor #, Class # and Class #
- Once you have all of your videos uploaded, follow the link to the Video Submission Form that was emailed to you in your Exhibitor Confirmation email or found on the Clark County 4-H Horse Project Facebook group page.
- You must submit a YouTube link of each class entered for it to be judged.
- If you need more assistance, see the **YouTube Cheat Sheet** for additional guided instructions.

IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS:
