#### **READING OF MINUTES**

Mark moved to approve March minutes, Glenna seconds, motion passes.

#### CORRESPONDENCE

- Amy received an email from Red Lion stating they will not be honoring the previous government rate of about \$90 per night for Labor Day dates requested in January. Rooms will now be \$303/night, adding about an extra \$5,000 to what was previously budgeted for judges board.
  - Email also states they may be willing to work with us on price in exchange for full access passes to fair/rodeo events. Amy working with fairboard to see about potentially offering some type of discount
  - o Amy looking into other options, we need 6 rooms for 4 nights.
    - Has contacted CWU regarding conference center, looked into Air BnBs, and will look into rooms in Yakima and paying travel for judges.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

- ➤ Nothing out of the ordinary
- ➤ Horse buckles, \$500 donation to teen, paid out some events (livestock, horse, shooting sports, national competition)
- Mark moved to approve treasurers report, Glenna seconded, motion passes.

# **COMMITTEE/PROJECT REPORTS**

- ➤ Teen (Chloe Clyburn reporting for Rachel)
  - Had meeting tonight, working on plans for fair booths for teen committee and endowment.

- Upcoming conference June 20-23<sup>rd</sup> at WSU, teen committee is requesting financial assistance in the amount of \$2000 to cove half of their cost for registration fees, which include room and meals. Total fees are \$295 for youth, \$200 for chaperones; 10 youth, 2 chaperones planning to attend.
  - Other half of registration fees to be paid by youth/chaperones personally.
- O Discussion ensued regarding budget, per Marie there are areas in the budget likely to spend less than their allotted amount.
- Glenna moves to approve to assist Teen Committee with up to \$2,000 (Half of fees for 10 youth x \$295 and 2 chaperones x \$200 = \$1,675). Mark seconds, motion passes.

## > Concession Booth

- o Jon thinking we will get booth second week of May.
- Planning for On Target to run booth on Patriot Night.
- o Suncadia has reached out, interested in having booth at events.
- o Would also like to have booth at Cle Elum Roundup July 28-29
- o Jon is working on getting old booth cleaned up and ready to sell.
  - Will be keeping sandwich prep station and utensils from old booth.

#### > Dog

- Working on a location for dogs to be benched/crated at fair. Hoping to come up with a solution at upcoming small animal meeting.
  - Discussion ensued about possibly having dogs back in the sheep barn. At livestock meeting, housing all swine in new barn which would help free up space.
  - Need to take into account prey/predator drive, climate control

- o Horse certificates due Friday 4/28/23.
- o Spring Leaders Show Saturday 4/29/23.
- Overall going well, judges lined up, experiencing aforementioned issue with hotel rooms.

## > Livestock

- o Beef pre-show took place 3/25/23, went well.
- Sheep/goat pre-show planned for 6/10/23.
  - Lots of young members this year, hoping to have an educational aspect to pre-show this year.
- o Swine weigh-in coming up 6/11/23, swine clinic 7/16/23.
- Request to raise bedding fee
  - This is a per animal fee vs. per pen fee
  - Discussion on how per pen may be better, not necessarily getting/using twice as much bedding for multiple animals. Can also get expensive for members exhibiting multiple animals/breeding stock.
  - Will hear if approved at next fairboard meeting

  - o 8 applicants interviewing next week.
- > Shooting sports
  - o Glenna reports all qualifiers are done with the exception of shotgun, community service, and leader training are done for the year.
  - o Preparing for state shoot in June, nationals also coming up
  - o Applied for \$5,000 grant from Toppenish Casino
- > Small Animal
  - o Working with Christy on organizing small animal pre-show.
    - No birds at pre-show due to bird flu
  - Official call has not been made whether birds will be able to attend fair. Will need to talk with state vet
  - o Cat
    - Cat will be included in small animal round robbin.
    - Currently do not have a senior cat member, but does have a cat that could be shown by senior small animal showmen in round robbin.
    - Pauline still working on judges, had one fall through. Lead on another judge in Yakima
