TREASURER'S REPORT All of Fair is reflected in the report. Marie is missing a bill or two related to Concessions.

Bank Change

- We have a bank account at Bank of the West. This is the concession booth operating account.
 Bank of the West is undergoing a change of ownership to Bank of Montreal (BOM) effective Labor Day weekend.
- While the change will not normally affect us, the one part that does is the fee for depositing cash. Their proposal is to move our checking account to a "Premium Business Checking" account. As long as we keep \$1500 in the account, there are no monthly fees. Our balance is usually at least \$2500. The problem identified is "coin and currency fees apply, including for deposits in excess of \$5,000 per statement period and 4 orders per statement period."
- O Here is what Marie sees: \$0.25 per \$100 deposited in coin and currency, \$4 per order of coin and currency, \$0.70 per standard strap of currency, \$0.04 per piece of non-standard strap of currency, \$6 per standard box of coin and \$0.20 per roll when a partial box of coin is requested. Think the cash coming out will not be a problem this year, but the deposit could be in excess of \$25 fee??
- Diana moved to switch to Cashmere Valley Bank where most of the other accounts are held. It
 would make moving money between accounts easier and less fees. Will have Marie Riegel and
 Kelsey Roseberry and Extension Staff (2023: Amy Alder or Alison White) as signers on the
 account at Cashmere Valley Bank.
