## GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

In compliance with a directive from the attorney general at Washington State University, we cannot accept entries for children under the age of eight (8). Please be sure that those handling or riding any horse on the show grounds be this age or older. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation. Thank you!

1. **CLASS DIVISIONS** 4-H Age Division is determined before October 1 of the current year. JUNIORS: 8 to 10 years of age. INTERMEDIATES: 11 to 13 years of age. SENIORS: 14 to less than 19 years of age as of September 30.

2. **HELMETS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL NOVICE, JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE, AND SENIOR EXHIBITORS IN ALL MOUNTED AND DRIVING CLASSES. NOVICES ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR HELMETS IN SHOWMANSHIP.** *We also recommend helmets be worn while working with the horses.*

3. Riders shall be properly attired. ENGLISH CLASSES: Riders should be attired in either hunt seat or saddle seat clothing. WESTERN CLASSES: riders should be attired in Western clothing: - a long-sleeved shirt with belt, boots, and hat/helmet.

4. This show follows **4-H RULES**. We reserve the right to refuse entry at any time for abusive behavior, intoxication, or disregard of safety rules. Protests must be accompanied by a \$10.00 deposit and presented to the Show Committee before the end of the show. Denial of protests forfeits the deposit.

5. **THE DECISIONS OF THE JUDGE ARE FINAL.**

6. No class to be used as a "schooling" class except Green Horse Class.

7. Reasonable gate holds will be granted. Please ask for gate hold TWO classes ahead.

8. No stallions allowed in Novice, Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Classes.

9. Owners are responsible for their horses at all times.

10. **No horses on grass at the North end of Bloom Pavilion.** If you need a stall, please purchase one.

11. Riding classes will be divided for safety reasons when there are more than 16 mounted or 6 driving exhibitors. Call back the class to determine the final placing.

12. Classes with less than 3 exhibitors may be combined or canceled. Check with the in-gate attendee in advance of class.

13. **STALLS:** Day stalls are available for \$5.00 each, and overnight stalls \$10.00 each. Please obtain your stall marker at the entry table for your stall(s) before stalling your horse(s). The stall marker must be visible on the stall. Please bring your shovels and rakes to clean out the stall(s) at the end of the day.

14. **CANCELLATION** of exhibitor's entry for any reason shall forfeit their entry fees, EXCEPT in the case of illness or injury to the horse, and a veterinarian certificate is presented to the Show Secretary before the first class is entered.

15. **PLEASE MAKE THIS A SAFE SHOW.** (Please place **RED RIBBONS** in the tails of horses that kick.)

16. **WARM-UP ARENA:** To be supervised by a leader or parent. Please walk your horse through the parking lot—not on the street to the warm-up arena.

## **Class Descriptions**

### **Spring Leaders Show 2024**

**Showmanship** – The purpose of showmanship is to learn courtesy, good grooming, poise, confidence, and how to fit, train, and handle a horse. Showmanship is a demonstration of the member's ability to show the animal, in hand, to its best advantage. Conformation of the animal is not considered.

**English Pleasure Classes** – To be ridden hunt seat or saddle seat. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring, unless it is specified to be a walk/trot class. To be judged on the manners and suitability of the horse.

**English Equitation Classes** – To be ridden hunt seat or saddle seat. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring, unless it is specified to be a walk/trot class. To be judged on riders' ability. Pattern may be required.

**Western Pleasure Classes** – To be shown at a walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring, unless it is specified to be a walk/jog class. To be judged on the manners and suitability of the horse.

**Western Equitation Classes** – To be shown at a walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring, unless it is specified to be a walk/trot class. To be judged on riders' ability. Pattern may be required.

**Green Horse Classes** – A green horse will be identified as a horse under 6 years old that has not been shown in a shank bit. An aged green horse will be identified as a horse 6 years old or older that has not been shown in a shank bit. To be shown at a walk - jog/trot - lope/canter both ways of the ring.

**English or Western Discipline Rail** – This is an advanced pleasure class that tests the skills of both horse and rider, as they execute specific gaits, transitions, and movements as requested by the judge. In this class, competitors are asked to do things other than just go around the rail- you may be asked to side pass, hand gallop, pivot, back up, roll back, lead change, extend trot, counter canter (lope), etc.- The class is judged on performance and manners. Competitors in this class can be dressed in either English or Western attire.

**Novice Riders** – NOVICE DEFINITION: First-year horse project members may choose to show novice class within their Age Division or the regular class in their age division. Novices of all ages are required to wear helmets in Showmanship. Novice riders need to choose if they are riding walk-jog/trot classes or walk-jog/trot – lope/canter classes. They cannot ride both. Please ask if you have questions regarding this.

**Obstacle Driving** – The driver will be required to drive over a course consisting of at least 8 obstacles. This tests the skill of the driver, the obedience and handiness of the animal, and the accuracy with which the course is driven

**Reinsmanship** – This class is designed to test the driver's knowledge of driving techniques and his or her ability to put that knowledge to use to present a proficient performance. Patterns are required. Reinsmanship is judged as an equitation class based on hands, seat, correct driving technique, and proper harnessing and hitching. Driver should be able to change gaits quickly, smoothly, and unobtrusively while always maintaining contact and demonstrating correct driving techniques.

**Pleasure Driving** - The pleasure-driving horse should have the same general qualities as the pleasure saddle horse. Special emphasis is placed on the quality of the gaits, manners, and the pleasure of the ride for the driver. The horse should be in balance with a head and neck carriage typical of its breed or type, should be light-mouthed, and have a free way of moving. Erratic movements are highly undesirable. Hesitation or breaking stride will be penalized.

**Driving Safety** – One properly dressed intermediate, senior, or adult header is required for each driver in the lineup. The header should enter the arena once all the entries have lined up and permission to enter has been granted. The header should not touch the animal except in case of a potential emergency.
