Temple Grandin

Many community youth are eligible to get involved in 4-H to learn and grow. Every school, in every state, includes youth who have special needs. Join Oregon 4-H Program volunteers and staff on February 12. Be inspired by 4-H alum, Temple Grandin (Colorado State University) as she talks about her experience learning with autism. Then, with the help of an instructor from *Kids Included Together* (KIT), we will practice skills and gain confidence in working beside 4-H youth who have special needs, such as physical, social, or learning disabilities. Explore opportunities for working with a child's family and school support systems. Understand strategies to recruit and engage youth with various levels of ability. Learn how to adapt 4-H activities and make accommodation for youth with special needs. After this Forum e-session, states will have access to many on-line learning modules (30-60 min each) on specific topics of their choice and individual consultations with KIT staff to address unique county and state needs. 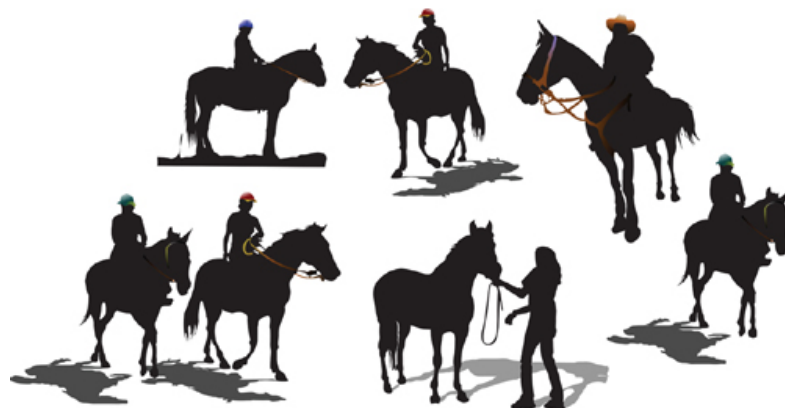
4-H Riding Event

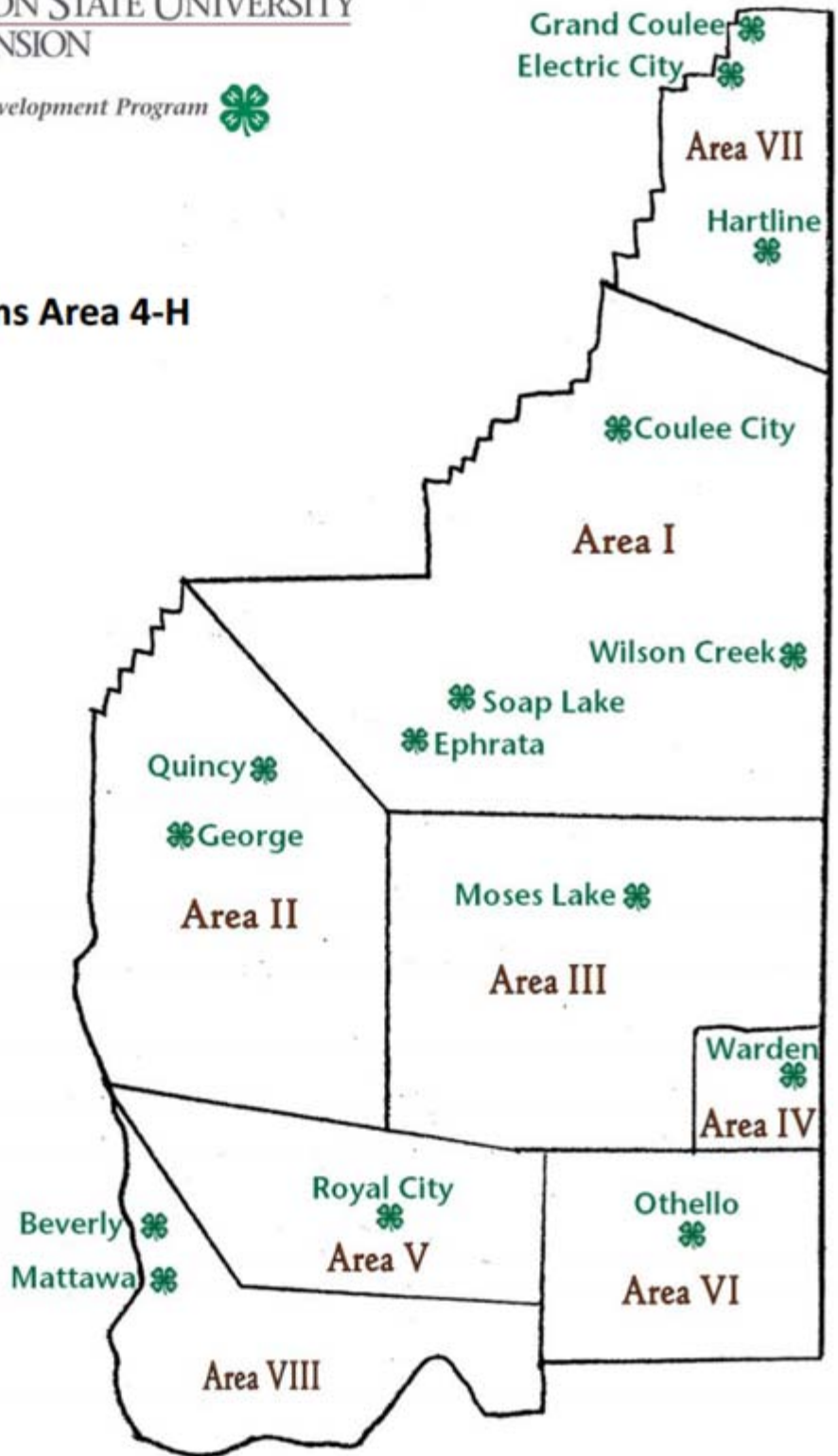
