Grant County Fair Pig Tags Available for Pick-Up

Grant County Fair—Pre-Tagging For Pigs is Required. Again this year, the Grant County Fair 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale Committee is requiring all 4-H clubs and FFA chapters to tag their pigs for the Grant County Fair prior to arriving at the fair. Swine leaders or FFA advisors may pick-up fair tags for individuals in their club/chapter between now-August 2 at the WSU Extension Office in Moses Lake or by other arrangements with Sarah Smith. Club leaders and advisors should tag pigs with the designated tags at the farm so the pigs arrive at the fair with tags in the pigs' ears. Do not bring the pigs to the Extension office or the Fairgrounds.

The goal of offering this pre-tagging is two-folds—First, we hope that this will speed up tagging and the time individuals and pigs have to wait in line to get weighed and tagged—reducing stress and waiting for everyone. Second, this should be less stressful for the pigs, as we will not have to remove tags and they will have time to heal prior to the fair. Please have your leaders and advisors call the office or email with the number of pigs that will be exhibited at the Grant County Fair by your club/chapter and when you would like to pick up the tags. Pigs that are NOT tagged when they arrive at the scale will have \$5 deducted from their sale checks. Please have ALL PIGS PRE-TAGGED so that we can weigh pigs in a timely fashion and decrease the amount of time in load-in lines.

Tagging pigs while they are smaller is easier because they are easier to restrain. This will also give the ear plenty of time to heal prior to the fair. The tags are self-piercing with a back button buttons, which will require an Allflex tagger with a blunt tip. We want the tag placed in the ear so that number is on the back side of the pigs ear. The tag should be placed in the center of the ear with the male portion (tag with the self-piercing stem) on the inside of the ear and the female button portion of the tag on the outside of the ear. ******Most of you are aware, but it is important to remind everyone that you will only be able to exhibit one market pig at the Grant County Fair this year. You can have a carcass pig in addition to the market hog, but the carcass hog will be taken out for harvest on Tuesday morning, August 13. Therefore it will not be available to be shown in fitting and showing or sold through the auction. This was not a decision the Livestock Sale Committee took lightly, as we recognize that some of you are raising two market hogs and would like to show both of them. However, pen space has become so limited and the concern of disease transmission back to pig farms in the area was the reason that this decision was made.***



Teen Leadership Summit Registration Due June 14



Grant County Fair Lamb and Goat Weigh and Tag Day

The Grant County 4-H/FFA lamb and goat weigh and tag day is **Friday, June 14, 2019 from 1:00 – 6:00 p.m. at the Grant County Fairgrounds.**

All 4-H and FFA market lambs and goats that will be exhibited at the Grant County Fair must be tagged and weighed at this time. If this date and time does not work for you, contact Sheep Superintendent, Gene Champion, 509.855.8420 or Sarah Smith, 509.760.6946 prior to June 14th to make other arrangements.



Please make sure that all lambs have proper scrapie identification at weigh-in—this includes both female and male lambs. **Lambs that do not have scrapie tags in their ears will not be weighed and are NOT eligible to show in the market lamb division of the Grant County Fair.**

New 4-H Year Annual Fall Kick Off Meeting

General club leaders, family 4-H group leaders, and volunteers assisting with 4-H finances are **required** to attend one of the annual Fall Kick-Off meetings. All leaders and prospective new leaders welcome! Kick Off meeting times are announced in the 4-H Friday Update each new 4-H year.

4-H Online Enrollment: Start of the New 4-H Enrollment Year is October 1

The 4-H year begins October 1 and ends September 30. Youth who have reached their 5th birthday before October 1 of the current 4-H year through youth who have not reached their 19th birthday before October 1 of the current 4-H year are eligible to enroll in a 4-H club. Enroll in 4-H using the [4HOnline system](https://www.4honline.com) (<https://www.4honline.com>). There is an additional \$25 fee for late enrollments. Please use Google Chrome or Firefox Web Browser for best results.

Report Your Volunteer Hours Each Month

Volunteer hours are due each year by October 1. If you are a volunteer leader, you need to log your volunteer hours at <https://volunteers.cahnrs.wsu.edu>. Your user name will be either your last name only or your first & last name with a space in between. The password is *password!* (don't forget the exclamation point). If you are unable to log in to the volunteer database, or if you have questions, please call the Extension office. **You CAN – and if possible, please do**, put in your volunteer hours retroactively – even for previous years!
