Frequently Asked Questions

- Q. What is required to become a certified WSU Master Gardener?**
- A. Attend 60+ hours of basic training and complete all assignments. Perform 50 hours of Master Gardener volunteer service.
- Q. Do I need to be recertified every year?**
- A. Yes, you must attend 10 hours of approved advanced training and perform 25 hours of volunteer service each year.
- Q. Is there a cost to attend the training and being part of the program?**
- A. Yes, the fee for volunteers to participate in the program is \$189. This covers \$75 for the online training program with WSU, a local fee of \$100 and \$14 for a background check.
- Q. Can I just take the training without committing to the volunteer time?**
- A. Yes, if you are employed in the landscape, nursery industry, or work for a government agency that requires horticultural skill, you may take the class for a fee of \$175.

WSU Master Gardener Program



Volunteers have the opportunity to:

- Expand their horticultural knowledge.
- Extend their knowledge on all aspects of consumer horticulture and gardening to the general public, including youth.
- Work as a team member to solve gardening problems.
- Serve their communities in a volunteer capacity.
- Enjoy the company of dedicated gardeners.

Primary responsibilities are to:

- Serve as an educator and resource person on horticulture and gardening topics.
- Compile and distribute educational materials on consumer horticulture.
- Assist in preparing and staffing exhibits, displays, booths, and demonstration sites.
- Serve as a team member with WSU Extension staff and other volunteers in planning and presenting consumer horticulture information.

Course instructors:

The course will be taught by WSU Extension faculty, Master Gardeners, and industry specialists. The online training program will be supplemented with hands-on and lab activities.

Volunteer qualifications:

- Have a strong volunteer ethic.
- Commit to becoming a volunteer educator for WSU Extension.
- Commit to the 60 hour WSU Master Gardener online volunteer basic training course and complete all assignments and quizzes.
- Volunteer a minimum of 50 hours of educational service during a one-year period upon completion of training.
- Be available to perform volunteer work at times needed by the local WSU Extension program.
- Pass a WSP background screening.
- Read, sign, and abide by the *WSU Master Gardener Pest Management Recommendation Agreement*.
- View the required Put the Child First training.

Online training program schedule:

The training will begin in September 2024. Participants will need access to a computer and an email address. Application are due by August 1, 2024. They can be hand delivered or mailed to the office. By email: ga.mgvolunteers@wsu.edu
