You will get the message every time you login until you have selected a supervisor for all the WSU programs for which you volunteer.
4. **Click "Enter Activity"** Select the appropriate information from each of the dropdown lists. Select the date on which the activity occurred. You may have to use the navigation arrows on the calendar to get to the correct month. You can enter multiple activities for the same day. However, each activity must have a different start and end time.
5. **Click the "Save"** After you save a record, there will be a message at the top of the page to indicate that the record was saved. At this point you may choose

another menu item on the left, logout, or add a new record. If you add a new record, simply change the information needed to reflect the new activity. You may click the "Clear the Form" button to start with a blank record.

All judging contest members are required to compete in the oral reasons class during the qualifying contest at State 4-H Fair in Puyallup. Here are a few tips for participants:

What are oral reasons? It is selecting and ranking the best of comparable items or animals and giving reasons for those chosen selections.

How are oral reasons judged? There are four important points to a good set of oral reasons:

- Knowledge of Subject.....40%
- Appropriate Terms.....25%
- Presentation.....20%
- Organization 15%

Your judge will look for accurate, clear-cut comparisons, knowledge of important qualities, ability to organize ideas and state them clearly, use of descriptive terms and general poise and confidence.

Scott Cotton will highlight preparation activities and basic biosecurity for fairs and livestock exhibitions. Dale Moore will focus on preventing disease from entering the livestock areas through effective use of the fair veterinarian.
