The Central Washington Junior Livestock show will begin on Sunday, May 4 with the tagging and weighing of the animals and ending on May 7 with the Market Livestock Sale. Check all dates and times in the Premium Book and posted on the shows bulletin board of time or event changes. Below are a few of the events:

Mon, May 5 – 9:30 am, 4-H/FFA Market Livestock Judging Contest for all exhibitors. Jessica Finnell, 4-H member will be here to show off the new Yakima County 4-H Livestock Judging jackets and answer any questions about the livestock judging team.

Mon, May 5 – 12:30-5:00 pm, Judging & classification of market livestock, list in premium book.

Tues, May 6 – 8:00 am-10:00 am, Selection of Grand Champion of all classes.

Tues, May 6 – 10:30 am, Fitting & Showing all species and all divisions.

Wed, May 7 – 8:00 am, Presentation of Special Awards Sales Arena

Wed, May 7 – 9:00 am, Market Sale begins.

If you wish to support an exhibitor with "Add on Support", this can be done any day of the show, Sunday-Wednesday. Forms are available in the show office with a \$15.00 minimum "Add on Support". If you cannot make it to the office you can mail in your Add on Support to CWJLS, PO Box 306, Toppenish,

WA 98948. Add on Support will not be accepted after the show.

If you wish to support an exhibitor by buying their animal, you have the choice of buying the animal and taking it home, or having it sent to the butcher of your choice. There is also the option of buying the animal and "turning it". The animal will go to the packing plant and they will pay floor price for the animal and you will pay the difference from floor price to bid price. Example You bid on Jane's pig, floor price is \$0.95 and you bid \$2.00 per lb. The pig weighs 235. Your cost will be \$246.75 (difference between \$0.95 and \$2.00).
