Hosting dates are **July 25-August 21**. Any family interested in hosting can begin an application by signing in at <http://www.states4hexchange.org/host-families/create-account.aspx>. Other screening requirements include background checks, two references, and an in-home interview. Delegates cannot be matched to a family until ALL paperwork is finished, however we can hold one for a short time while the family completes the process. Delegates are labeled with their gender (M), their age, their Japanese organization, and then their individual state ID number. For example "M12 (Lex) WA#22" is a 12-year -old male who belongs to Lex in Japan with the state number of 22.

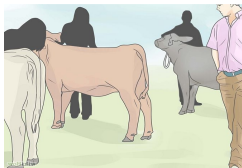

COMPETITION: HOW DO YOU HANDLE IT?

Competition itself is neither good nor bad. It's how it's handled. Adults have a tremendous impact on how competition affects youth. Here's a way to check if you're on the right track.



- When a child finishes a competition do you ask: *What did you learn? Did you enjoy yourself? Did you meet any interesting people? Did you do your best? Instead of - Who won? What did you get?*
- Do you have fun during competition yourself?
- Do you model it for children?
- Do you keep competition fun by providing success and rewards for everyone, not just the "winner"?
- When you choose a competitive activity, do you consider the age and developmental level of the participants? Does the activity have realistic goals?
- Is the emphasis of the competition on skill development and personal growth rather than winning or losing?
- Do you realize the tremendous impact one adult's attitude can have on a child?

If your answer is YES to most of these questions, then you are making competition a healthy, enjoyable part of your children's learning.

**TEEN NEWS****REASON #10 TO ATTEND 2015 4-H TEEN CONFERENCE: THE GOOD, THE BAD & THE UGLY OF CREDIT**

This workshop will be presented to youth who attend Teen Conference - one of many lessons in financial literacy.

Youth will learn about wants vs. needs, wise spending decisions, and how to use credit cards responsibly. They will participate in a hands-on credit exercise where they each receive a *Teens Credit Card* with a credit limit of \$1,000 or \$2,000. Then they are able to use their *Teens Credit Card* to make purchases at a simulated mall. After they have spent their limit, they learn the true costs of using credit by learning how much and how long it is going to take them to pay off their *Teens Credit Card*. This workshop will show teens the good, the bad, and the ugly of credit cards and how interest charges, fees, and paying just the minimum balance can be a trap that can negatively affect their financial well-being for years. This hands-on workshop provides youth the opportunity to engage in an interactive, fun, safe environment that will help them learn how to effectively use credit cards throughout their lives.
