SIGN-UP TODAY AS 4-H VOLUNTEER,

Do you help with finances for your child's 4-H club? Do you act as a livestock project leader? Are you planning 4-H activities, fundraising, or community service projects for your child's 4-H club? If you answered "yes" to any of these questions, you should complete the Volunteer Application and sign-up as a 4-H volunteer. If you are unsure if your leadership or support roles with 4-H are those of a volunteer, feel free to call Jenny at the Extension office at 574-1600.

WSU Extension volunteers complete a Volunteer Application and agree to follow behavioral guidelines in "A Volunteer Partnership" (C1000). Applicants also agree to a background screening and they will complete a Child Protection and Child Abuse Prevention training video. Volunteers also complete a leader training with Extension staff. To be covered by the liability protection of WSU, you need to be signed up as a WSU volunteer. Volunteers may also be covered by the Department Labor and Industries medical aid program if they are injured while acting as a volunteer. As a volunteer, you can also donate your hours and show the value of our 4-H Program to those who provide our funding.

Leaders, every hour you spend supporting 4-H is a donation. By donating your volunteer hours, you give

Yakima County 4-H the numeric proof we need to show our funders and higher-officials that our programs are greatly valued and needed. Officially donating (reporting) your hours also makes you eligible for the Department of Labor and Industries medical aid program. Participation in the medical aid program allows an injured volunteer's medical expense to be paid by the Department of Labor and Industries. **What qualifies as volunteer hours?** Anything and everything you do for 4-H! Teaching, planning, prepping, shopping, paperwork, training, driving, calling, mentoring, presenting, emailing, even reading this! If it's for 4-H, it counts!

1. **Website:** <http://ext.wsu.edu/Volunteers/logon.aspx>
2. **Login** with your WSU Volunteer System User Name and password (*Contact the office, 509-574-1600 or yakima.4H@wsu.edu if you need that information.*)
3. **Select "Volunteers"** If you get the message "You are missing a supervisor entry. Please click 'Program Supervisor' in the menu on the left". Follow the instructions. You will get the message every time you login until you have selected a supervisor for all the WSU programs for which you volunteer.
4. **Click "Enter Activity"** Select the appropriate information from each of the dropdown lists. Select the date on which the activity occurred. You may have to use the navigation arrows on the calendar to get to the correct month. You can enter multiple activities for the same day. However, each activity must have a different start and end time.
5. **Click the "Save"** After you save a record, there will be a message at the top of the page to indicate that the record was saved. At this point you may choose another menu item on the left, logout, or add a new record. If you add a new record, simply change the information needed to reflect the new activity. You may

click the "Clear the Form" button to start with a blank record.

It's that simple. Make it a habit and help our local 4-H program succeed!

STATE NEWS**IT'S TIME TO PREPARE FOR NEW ANTIBIOTIC REGULATIONS**

The new Food and Drug Administration regulations will affect all U.S. poultry and livestock producers, including anyone raising pigs, including youth exhibitors. Because of this, the National Pork Board has been urging all its stakeholders to get ready now, before the new antibiotic regulations take effect on January 1, 2017.

"If they haven't already done so, pork producers and youth exhibitors should sit down with their veterinarians and determine what they need to do to comply with the new veterinary feed directive (VFD) and prescription requirement for water-based medications," says Jennifer Koeman, DVM, Pork Checkoff's director of producer and public health.

Although certification in the Pork Quality Assurance® Plus or Youth Pork Quality Assurance® Plus program should provide a good foundation, Koeman says some new requirements, such as keeping original copies of VFDs for two years (producer, veterinarian and feed mill) will be adjustments.

To help keep things simple, the National Pork Board has introduced the USCARE checklist. It offers six key steps for producers and exhibitors to take to prepare for the regulatory changes. For additional information about the antibiotic changes, visit www.pork.org/antibiotics.

- U**nderstand the new feed (VFD) and water (Rx) rules.
- S**trengthen your vet-client-patient relationship (VCPR).
- C**ommunicate with your feed mill.
- A**ssess your herd-health and welfare strategies.
- R**enew your commitment to responsible antibiotic use.
- E**nsure your record-keeping compliance.

Last year the Western Poultry Scholarship and Research Foundation granted 19 scholarships to qualified students. Since 1965 PEPA has assisted outstanding college students in achieving their scholastic goals!!

Awards are made available for students currently enrolled in a college or university. High school graduating seniors qualify for scholarships upon entering their freshman year. The scholarship year begins with the fall semester/quarter of the respective year and runs through the spring term of the following year. If a student graduates mid-term they are eligible for 1/2 of the total scholarship award.

Applications must be received in the PEPA office no later than January 23, 2017. Public announcement of the awards will be made during the PEPA Annual Convention being held Feb. 26 - March 1, 2017. Scholarship recipients as well as all other applicants will receive notification by mail following the announcement of the awards.
