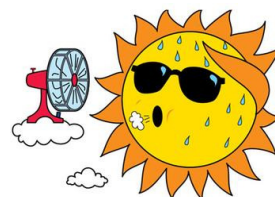

KEEP LIVESTOCK COOL

The “heat dome”—when high atmospheric pressure causes a heat wave to go on and on and on—has humans



across the country glued to their favorite armchair in front of the air conditioner. Livestock accommodations generally lack such luxuries, leaving our four-legged friends vulnerable to stress, heat stroke—and even death.

Keeping cows, sheep, chickens, pigs, goats, horses, and other livestock cool isn’t rocket science, but it takes some planning. Heat stress can occur anytime the mercury rises above 80 degrees Fahrenheit or so, especially for animals being worked (fair animals), confined in close quarters without ventilation, or lacking access to shade. Goats are among the most heat tolerant livestock, as are, surprisingly, sheep—their wool actually protects them from extreme heat as well as cold. Pigs and cattle are among the least heat-tolerant livestock.

The signs of heat stress: Horses become visibly wet with sweat, but pigs, goats, sheep, and cows don’t have the type of sweat glands that help them cool off. Instead their snouts may be wet to the touch from sweat, and their mouths may hang open slightly. Chickens open their beaks and spread their wings when they are extremely hot. Classic signs of heatstroke in all livestock include lethargy, disorientation, trembling, and lack of appetite.

If such symptoms occur, immediately move the animal into the shade, provide cool drinking water, and gently spray them down with a hose. It’s a good idea to keep electrolytes on hand, which can be mixed into drinking water to revive an overheated, dehydrated animal.

Every 4-H and FFA livestock exhibitor is required to keep an accurate set of records and is required to submit a Record Book. Books will be judged and premium points awarded.

Below is the score sheet that will be used to judge the Record Books. Make sure all signatures are signed by member, parent and leader where required. **Remember** the judging committee does not want your permanent record book – merely the record sheets listed for your current livestock projects, plus the front and back cover.

They must be in a report cover. **No 3-ring binders. ** NEW CHANGE **** regarding record books. **4-H: Level 2 book (CO934) only accepted** along with **Project Add Sheets**, in this order. Do Not include Permanent Record book

Pages must be in a folder with fasteners.

3 RING BINDERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

1 Cover: must be neat with full name, address, club name, years in 4-H, age division and County. Book is in order with dividers as listed here	5
2 Planning Calendar: Use to plan the whole 4-H year. Must include all events pertaining to your project and all Club <u>and</u> all County events such as poster contests, talent shows, fairs, etc. Checked what events you attended.	10
3 Code of Ethics: Must be signed by member, parent, leader and dated.	5
4 Project Record/Plans: Needs to have three complete and realistic plans for your project. Must show something you want to learn and some project goals. Member, leader and parent sign and date. Complete at beginning of 4-H year.	15
5 Project Journal: Needs to show all project work and activities. Must be used from the beginning of the project to now. Show what was done, how it was done, what was learned, etc. Make comments.	20
6 Project Expenses – Use Add Sheet for Project: Complete information with up-to-date expense totals, beginning inventory, dates you weighed your animal, all feed and other items purchased. You won't be able to complete the Income portion until after the fair. 7 Project Pictures/Information: Make sure you caption the pictures and date them.	5
8 Project Highlights: Needs to tell what was learned, problems and/or successes. Tell whether or not you met your goals and why or why you didn't meet your goals.	5
9 4-H Story: Must be started and introduction done.	10
10 Supplemental Page: 4-H pictures and other information should be added to highlight the year, not project related. Date and caption.	5
