**PAPER CLOVER UPDATES**

Some new features and changes to the spring Paper Clover promotion happening from May 8-19 at all Del's stores. Here is how the new county incentive program works so that you can encourage counties to become eligible to receive additional funding through Paper Clover

- 1. \$5 Paper Clover:** In addition to the \$1 Paper Clover, there will now be a \$5 Paper Clover available which will be larger than the original.
- 2. Coupons:** Both the \$1 and \$5 Paper Clovers will have a \$1 or \$2 Purina coupon attached available to customers when they make a donation to 4-H.
- 3. State Incentive:** One winning state from each region will be selected to receive an award of \$1,000 for being the top performing state by having the highest average amount of dollars raised. To be eligible, the state must have a minimum of at least 50% of their counties participating in the county incentive program.
- 4. County Incentive:** Starting this spring promotion, counties will be given an extra incentive to help their Tractor Supply Company (TCS) store raise more funds for their 4-H program. Any county program that participates with some kind of in-store activity and returns the participation form will be eligible to receive 100% of the funds raised **above** what that store raised in the spring 2012 Paper Clover promotion.

**TOPPENISH LIVESTOCK SHOW ORAL REASONS CONTEST**

An oral reasons class will again be available at the Central Washington Junior Livestock Show at Toppenish. Thank You's to the Board for providing this important and necessary opportunity for our youth. All judging contest members are required to compete in the oral reasons class during the qualifying contest at State 4-H Fair in Puyallup. Here are a few tips for participants:

**What are oral reasons?** It is selecting and ranking the best of comparable items or animals and giving reasons for those chosen selections.

**How are oral reasons judged?** There are four important points to a good set of oral reasons:

Knowledge of Subject.....	40%
Appropriate Terms.....	25%
Presentation.....	20%
Organization.....	15%

Your judge will look for accurate, clear-cut comparisons, knowledge of important qualities, ability to organize ideas and state them clearly, use

of descriptive terms and general poise and confidence.

**How to prepare for oral reasons:** A suggested training form for organizing oral reasons is below:

**NORTHWEST JUNIOR SHEEP EXPOSITION**

The 2013 Northwest Junior Sheep Exposition (NWJSE) will be held July 19-20 at the Grant County Fairgrounds in Moses Lake, Washington. The show dates have been moved from the traditional Thursday and Friday event, to a Friday and Saturday event to accommodate more working families and to move events in conjunction with the Washington State Sheep Producers' Ram and Ewe Sale. The Junior Sheep Expo offers an excellent opportunity for young people from throughout the Pacific Northwest to showcase their sheep projects in a competitive, fun, and educational environment.

This event will include classes for market lambs, prospect lambs, and breeding sheep. Other competitions include the Sheep Skill-A-Thon, which tests one's knowledge and skill in sheep husbandry and educational displays. The NWJSE uses ultrasound technology and an indexed appraisal system that promotes a more accurate and systematic market lamb evaluation and enhances the educational experience of exhibitors and spectators.

Due to the excellent financial support of several organizations and donors, over \$2,000 in cash prizes and awards will be presented.

This year will again feature a special class, Washington State Sheep Producers Show Ewe Lamb Futurity Class, for youth to purchase high quality ewe lambs to bring back and show at the 2014 show.

### 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS LEADER TRAINING

May 3-4, 2013, Okanogan County Training Disciplines Offered: Archery, Rifle, and Pistol. Friday's training will only offer the Rifle discipline. Saturday's training day will offer all three disciplines, Archery, Rifle, and Pistol.

Fee: \$55/one discipline certification or \$80/two discipline certification. Okanogan County 4-H leaders may deduct \$15 off the registration fee.

Receive certification for two disciplines in a

single weekend. This leader training and certification meets the educational training requirements to serve as a 4-H Shooting Sports volunteer leader within Washington State. In accordance with state policies, 4-H Shooting Sports instructors at the county level must:

- Be 21 years of age (18 years old for assistant instructors)
- Be a currently enrolled 4-H Leader through their local WSU County Extension Office
- Successfully complete a minimum of 11 hours of Extension approved/sanctioned instructor-training
- Be trained and certified for each discipline(s) (Rifle, Pistol and Archery) that they are teaching at the county level.
