IMPORTANT IRS FILING INFORMATION

Remember that the deadline for filing your 990 E-postcard is May 15. Your filing date may vary based on the date that you gave the IRS at the end of your tax year. If you attempt to file the postcard and are not successful, print out proof that you tried and keep a copy of that screen. Also forward it to Bonnie Bonnie.Abercrombie@co.yakima.wa.us or Jenny Jennifer.Loyd@co.yakima.wa.us, so the office also has a copy of the document. If you have received a threatening letter from the IRS, please let Bonnie know at the office and she will attempt to resolve the issue without filling out additional paperwork. EQUINE STRUCTURAL INTEGRATION PRACTITIONER

She is a dedicated student of the horse and still has her first horse, Chulie, whom she has owned for 18 years. THOROUGHBRED GELDING

Thoroughbred Gelding – Anyone who would be interested in doing a care-lease for my horse? He is registered with the Jockey Club as Stevens Pass, we just called him Junior. He has had 90 days of professional training and for the last 18 months he has been rode with a private trainer in the arena and on trails. In the arena he is pretty mellow I would say temperament of around a 4. On the trails he gets pretty nervous, you need to be able to handle him in the wide open spaces. This is why I feel he needs to be shown or evented. He seems to like arena work. Junior is 9 years old, he is a Thoroughbred Gelding. He would work for a beginner **with supervision but not alone**. He would **be best suited for an advanced** beginner, because he does have energy, but he is respectful. Junior has never offered to buck or anything in the arena, he is super sweet and wants to please. He is an in your pocket kind of horse and loves attention. He has had extensive ground work done and will lock on to you in the round pen. He is very respectful with his ground manners. I have worked him a lot on the ground and in the arena. I wanted a trail horse and so bought a different one for myself. He loves bathes and that is why he looks wet in the pictures, he just had a bath.

PROJECT FINANCING AVAILABLE

Through its Rural Youth Loan Program, the Farm Service Agency provides financial assistance to youth between the ages of 10 and 20 who want to establish and operate their own modest size income producing project. Each project must be part of an organized and supervised program of work in participation with an established organization, such as 4-H or FFA. Loans may be used to buy livestock, plant stock, equipment and supplies, and to pay annual operating expenses with a maximum loan limit of \$5,000. Repayment terms depend on the type of loan and the loan will be repaid with income proceeds from the project.
