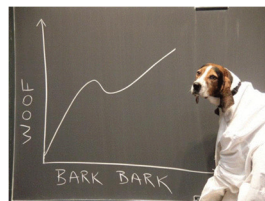

PROJECT NEWS

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP TIMELINES

4-H members need to be completely enrolled (forms completed, signed and turned in to the Extension office, their Club Assessment fee paid) and their animals must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for the following periods of time prior to the official county exhibit activity, including junior livestock shows:

- Rabbits and Poultry** – 45 days
 - Dogs** – 60 days
 - Goat** – 60 days
 - Sheep and Swine** (Breeding & Market) – 60 days
 - (Rule 5C for CWJLS) 90 days Equine** – 90 days (Make sure your horse certificate is on file 90 days before first show/event)
 - Dairy**–90 days, Dairy Heifer Replacement– 60 days, (Make sure your dairy certificate is on file 90 or 60 days before first show/event)
 - Market Beef** – 120 days, Breeding Beef – 90 days
- Animals raised by the 4-H member from birth or hatching are exempt from the minimum time periods
- Cavies** – 45 days
 - Cats** – 60 days
 - Llama** – 90 days

“This is How We Roll!”, West Valley Fair, **July 18-20**.
Horse show, **July 15**, Dog show, **July 13**.

All exhibitors are **required** to participate in at least one fairground work day prior to the fair. Those not participating in a work day will be required to put in 3 hours of clean up time during the fair. Work days will be **9:00 am on June 22, and July 6**. Make sure you sign-in when attend a work day to receive credit.

Show entry deadlines are:

- May 1** – Club pre-entry forms due
- May 15** – Cat, Critter & Livestock Show entry due
- July 2** – Dog Show entry forms due
- July 13** – 9:00 am, Blue Barn entries
- July 17** – Livestock weigh-in/all large animals

4-H OR FFA EXHIBITORS SALE SUPPORT

You can support any exhibitor by bidding on their market animal on the day of the sale. You will have the choice of taking it home (TAKE HOME) or having it sent to the butcher of your choice (CUSTOM), or “turning the animal” (TURN). “Turning the animal” means you win the bid and tell the auctioneer to “turn the animal”, you do not get the animal it will be sent to the packing plant, you pay the difference from floor price (the price the packing plant pays) and what your winning bid was. Example, you bid \$2.50 on a 250-pound pig, the floor price is \$1.50, and you turn the animal. You will pay the difference of \$2.50 (your bid) minus \$1.50 (floor price). Therefore, you will pay \$250 and the packing plant will pay \$375. The exhibitor will receive \$625.00. Take home animals must be removed from the grounds by you immediately after the sale.

If you wish to support an exhibitor by doing “Add on Support”, this can be done any day of the show. You will determine an amount you wish to give directly to the exhibitor. Stop by the show office and complete the “Add on Support” form. Any questions ask the show office. Custom, Take Home and Add on Support are to be paid the day of the sale.

WEST VALLEY FAIR RECORD BOOK SCORESHEET

The West Valley Fair record book scoresheet is available in the Extension office or can be downloaded at Yakima County 4-H Extension website <http://ext100.wsu.edu/yakima/wp-content/uploads/sites/25/2015/03/Record-Book-Score-Sheet-WVF1.pdf>. Diane Jones, 833-3175, has offered to help anyone with their record book and answer questions.

Record books must include cover, calendar, code of ethics, project record for each project (includes plans,

journal, summary, pictures, costs, health records) included in journal or add sheet, a permanent record book, 4-H story started, and supplemental pages.

Front cover should be neat with name, complete mailing address, city, state and zip code. Club name and County name should be listed.

Signatures – Member, Leader and parent signatures required at beginning of 4-H year on journal plans and code of ethics.

Project Journal/Diary and add sheets should match with totals, inventory and weight record.

WEST VALLEY FAIR LIVESTOCK JUDGING ORAL REASONS CONTEST

One set of oral reasons will be required of 4-H Seniors and Intermediates. Juniors may participate, but not required at the CWJLS Livestock Judging Contest. Thank You to the Board for providing this important and necessary opportunity for our youth.

Judging contest members are required to compete in the oral reasons class at State 4-H Fair in Puyallup. Here are a few tips for participants:

What are oral reasons? It is selecting and ranking the best of comparable items or animals and giving reasons for those chosen selections.

How are oral reasons judged? There are four important points to a good set of oral reasons:

- Knowledge of Subject..... 40%
- Appropriate Terms..... 25%
- Presentation 20%
- Organization 15%

Your judge will look for accurate, clear-cut comparisons, knowledge of important qualities, ability to organize ideas and state them clearly, use of descriptive terms and general poise and confidence.

- Steer tag day and weigh in, **April 13**, 8:00 am-12:00 pm. **Steers need to be registered online prior to tag day!**
- Tag day for sheep, goats, and swine is **June 1**, 8:00 am-12:00 pm.

If animals lose their ear tag, superintendents must be immediately notified and retagged per the superintendent.

Each exhibitor will be able to tag 2 animals and one family alternate. Alternate tags will be a different color.

Examples:

Family has 3 children. Each child can tag 2 animals and an additional 3 animals can be tagged for family alternates.

Family has 2 children. Each child can tag 2 animals and an additional 2 animals can be tagged for family alternates

All animals must be registered online for the fair by 11:59 pm on May 31. <http://yvfair-rodeo.org/online-registration>. Will open April 1. **Exception for Small Animals and non-livestock exhibits.

4-H Age division is based on the age of the member on October 1st of the current 4-H year, which is from October-September. Primary/Cloverbud – Ages 5-7. Junior – Ages 8-10, Intermediate – Ages 11-13, Senior – Ages 14-19

- **All exhibitors must complete a Record Book for livestock and dairy projects.** See [Record Book section](#) for more information.
- Exhibitors must be performing regular care and management for the following minimal period of time:

GENDRON RANCH LIVING HISTORY MUSEUM

Gendron Ranch Living History Museum is in the process of creating an everyday farm life, hands-on, experiential venue at the National Historic site - O.J. Gendron Ranch, near Moxee, WA. The time-period we will portray is from 1917 to 1923. This is at the end of WWI, going through Prohibition, Women's' suffrage, TB, the Flu epidemic, yet before the flapper era or the Great Depression. It was a time when people had to be fairly self-sufficient, yet were dependent on their neighbor to be able to make it.

As part of our mission, we would like to partner with 4-H groups from all project areas, including animals (chickens, rabbits, cows, pigs, pigeons, horses, and sheep, etc.), public speaking, history, gardening, cooking, canning, sewing, etc.

Our site would provide 4-H youth an opportunity to work on their projects, show and tell the public about what they are learning and provide a way for them to meet many of the goals that 4-H requires them to do throughout the year.

One current and upcoming example is that we are due to get Heritage Speckled Sussex chicken eggs from a breeder in Michigan in June or July to begin our flock for the farm. We would like to have talked with leaders, students and their parents about how these soon to be chicks might be their project and have the details in place before the chicks hatch. Either the students will raise the chicks at home, or at the farm. Our goal for the student is to raise chickens that love to be picked up and held. We know that people coming to the farm will want to hold a chicken. Everyone wants to hold a chicken! Students who raise the chickens can talk to the public about chickens, and even present posters or whatever they need to do for 4-H.

Another example is that we could hold mock shows yet with a real judge, for students raising sheep or other animals to come and get experience showing before West Valley Fair. We would have the students dress in period clothing (we hope to get a grant to have clothes

made for them), but they would be showing in the pasture before the judge and in front of the public. It would be a safe, fun, learning experience for them and their animal (s) and give them the confidence to show well at West Valley.

I would love to talk with you about how Gendron Ranch could help your students and group complete their 4-H project requirements and have fun in a safe, non-threatening atmosphere.
