Yakima County 4-H is honored to announce their stellar 2020 Leader of the Year. 2020 was an unusual and challenging year and Netta Haller rose to the prominence in 4-H leadership while successfully carrying out positive 4-H programming and allowing youth to have opportunities to shine, be engaged, and stay connected under extremely difficult situations.

Netta Haller has been a leader for 7 years and main club leader for Sagebrush Riders (SBR) for many years. SBR is a dynamic, youth led, youth engaged club that normally hosts two horse shows each year. Netta is active in the Leader's Council, Horse Council, and

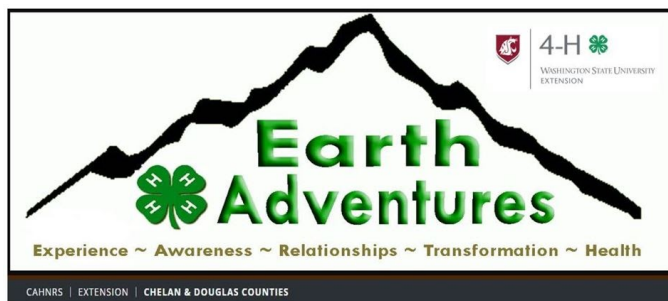

YAKIMA COUNTY 4-H "I DARE YOU" AWARD WINNERS FOR 2020

Each year Yakima County 4-H leaders select teen youth for the "I Dare You" Danforth Leadership Award. This award is sponsored by the American Youth Foundation. The recognition is based on personal growth through leadership experiences. These teen leaders are actively engaged in bettering the communities in which they live. Leadership, integrity, and compassion for others make "I Dare You" winners outstanding representatives of 4-H. It is an honor to announce this year's inspiring award winners, Evin Harvey and Hannah Grace Koffler.



Our first "I Dare You Winner" is Evin Harvey, a senior of Sagebrush Riders 4-H Club (SBR). Her 4-H achievements include: Club Sergeant at Arms, Club Secretary, Presentation to Granges, Eastern Washington 4-H Teen Rally, Washington State Junior Horse Show Fair Board Youth Representative and Know Your Government Delegate. Evin has been a Sagebrush Rider 4-H member for ten years. She has shined exhibiting her horse projects, encouraging her peers, and mentoring young and new members. She is an

exemplary 4-Her, excelling in leadership and community service projects.

This past year, amidst Covid-19 restrictions and disappointments, Evin was instrumental in organizing and assembling gifts and memorabilia for six graduating seniors. She has actively participated in numerous other SBR community service projects, including: Rod's House meal preparation; assembling Easter baskets for distribution to local foster kids; and painting and refreshing the outdoor sensory course at the Pegasus Therapeutic Riding Center.

In her community, Evin's activities include Yakima Valley Team Penning Club member, Washington State High School Equestrian (WAHSET) Team. Her achievements from Naches Valley High School include: National Honor Society Member, Junior class ASB President and takes Honors & College credit classes. She recently led her Junior class as the Associated Student Body President and was a captain of her varsity High School soccer team.

In addition, Evin has regularly held a paying job. Most notably, she has spent five seasons working for the White Pass Recreation Center, most recently as a youth ski instructor.

Evin's personal growth in citizenship and leadership is set against a backdrop of competing at

the highest levels of competition, including winning prestigious awards such as the Regional (WA vs. OR) High School Equestrian Team Championship title in Team Penning.

Evin is a great role model for youngsters. With a smile, she regularly encourages youth both within 4-H and in her community. She is a spectacular youth leader worthy of the "I Dare You"



Leadership Award.

Our next "I Dare You" winner is Hannah Grace Koffler, a Junior, also a member of Sagebrush Riders (SBR) for 8 years. Her responsibilities and leadership roles in her 4-H have included: holding the offices of Secretary, Reporter, Vice-President and served on the horse show awards committee. Gracie has excelled in exhibiting her horse projects and growing her leadership skills, while holding club office and organizing and participating in community service activities.

Gracie has been an exemplary vice-president, always prepared and ready to lead. She has a

record of good attendance and has established a regular meeting segment where she reviews 4-H exhibitor rules.

She has sat on a number of SBR committees, including coordinating awards for our annual horse shows. And, she has participated in numerous SBR community service projects, including: Rod's House meal preparation, to feed youth experiencing homelessness or housing instability; making Easter baskets for local foster children; and painting outdoor sensory obstacles at the Pegasus Therapeutic Riding Center.

Hannah Grace's responsibilities and leadership experiences in school, community include Yakima Valley Team Penning Club member, Washington State High School Equestrian (WAHSET) Team, and Pegasus Project Therapeutic Riding Volunteer.

Outside of 4-H, Gracie chose a homeschooling approach, wherein she had to be organized and self-monitor her time. This allowed her the flexibility to compete at Arabian Horse breed shows, to regularly volunteer her time at the Pegasus Project Therapeutic Riding Center, and to hold a job nannying a couple days a week. She recently started Running Start classes, at Yakima Valley Community College, wherein she's taken on an ambitious workload gearing up for early entrance to their vet tech program, in the Spring.

Gracie has a vested interest in veterinary skills. Her main show horse has been sidelined, going on two years, with an injury and recent surgery. Throughout, she has remained positive, and used the opportunity to expand into learning and competing in new disciplines, while helping her horse through surgery and recovery.

Gracie's personal growth in citizenship and leadership is set against a backdrop of performing arts talents. She competes in vocal competitions and has dedicated endless hours to rehearsing and performing in High School plays, including her awesome performance in "Annie".

Hannah Grace is looked up to by her peers and adults. She can often be found encouraging others. She is conscientious and can be counted on to pay attention to details while following through with her commitments, making her another inspiring recipient of the "I Dare You" Leadership Award.

Yakima County 4-H is extremely proud of this year's "I Dare You" Award winners, Evin Harvey and Hannah Grace Koffler, youth leaders who have inspired both youth and adults by their integrity, hard work, accomplishments, and service to others.
