
Successfully Navigating 4-H Market Livestock Projects- Raising a 4-H market livestock animal (beef, lamb, swine, or goat) can be an overwhelming experience, particularly for the first-time family. There are several steps and actions the 4-H member, leader, and family will take throughout the year to complete this project experience. Carefully reading this publication and following the provided guidance will help 4-H members, leaders and families successfully navigate the many steps involved with raising a market livestock project from start to finish.



"Meating" the Grade: Raising Market-Ready Youth Lamb Projects-Market lambs are popular 4-H and FFA projects for many youth. While youth learn to select, feed, manage, show and sell their market animals, they also develop many important life skills. They learn how to set goals, solve problems, make good decision, keep accurate records, and manage money. One of the outcomes of this process is that youth produce a market lamb that hopefully meets or exceeds the quality standards set forth by the American lamb industry and, ultimately, consumer of lamb.

By reporting your hours you give Yakima County 4-H the numeric proof we <u>need</u> to show our funders and higher-officials that our programs are greatly valued and needed. In addition, reporting your hours makes you eligible for the Dept. of Labor and Industries medical aid program (this program allows an injured volunteer's medical expense to be paid by the Department of Labor and Industries), and allows you protection under the state of Washington tort claims law, RCW 4.92.060, for acts or omissions while performing, or in good faith purporting to perform, your official volunteer duties.

What qualifies as volunteer hours? Anything and everything you do for 4-H! Teaching, planning, prepping, shopping, helping at fair and other events, paperwork, training, driving, calling, mentoring, presenting, emailing, even reading this! If it's for 4-H, it counts!
