4-H County Council meeting YOUR INPUT IS GREATLY NEEDED

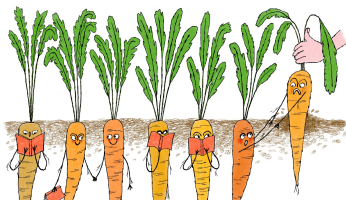

USDA Launches 'Protect Our Pigs' Campaign to Support the Pork Industry, Pig Owners, Veterinarians in the Fight Against African Swine Fever

The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) announced today new efforts to help prevent the introduction and spread of African swine fever in the U.S. Through an outreach and awareness campaign called "Protect Our Pigs," APHIS will support commercial pork producers, veterinarians, and pig owners with information and resources to help safeguard America's swine population and the pork industry. African swine fever is a deadly, highly contagious viral disease that affects both domestic and wild pigs. It does not impact human health but quickly spreads between swine populations. People can also unknowingly spread the disease on their clothing, farming equipment, or by transporting uncooked pork products. African swine fever has never been detected in the U.S. but has recently been confirmed in countries as close as the Dominican Republic and Haiti. There is no treatment or effective vaccine for the disease.

ANIMALS AND EXTREME HEAT

CARING FOR ANIMALS DURING EXTREME HEAT

We welcome the longer days and warmer weather that summer brings, but with shifting weather patterns and a trend towards higher temperatures, extreme heat is emerging as an issue for livestock.

Managing animals in high temperatures requires good planning. Keeping an eye on the weather forecasts and developing a plan for days of high to extreme temperature is essential in ensuring that your animals will have sufficient shade and water on very hot days. Extreme heat causes significant stress for animals. There are a few simple guidelines you can follow to reduce the impacts of high temperatures on animals. * Plentiful supply of clean, cool water. Suitable shelter or shade. Best type of shelter protects the animals from the sun and allows for the cooling effect of wind to breeze through. * Handling. Try not to handle the animals during the heat of the day. Try early mornings or late evenings.

Animals at high risk of heat stress include: > Young animals > Sheep that are newly shorn are at risk of sunburn > Beef cattle with black hair suffer more than those with lighter hair, although those with pink skin are at risk of sunburn. Holsteins are less tolerant than Jersey cows > Cattle, alpacas and llamas are more prone to heat stress than sheep and goats. Identifying heat stress: * Panting * Increased respiration rate * increased water intake * loss of appetite * listless/lethargy * increased salivation * in severe cases may become unconscious. If your animals are showing signs of heat stress, actions to cool them down should be taken immediately.

* Move them to shade somewhere with a breeze, * Encourage them to drink cool water, but encourage them to drink small amounts, Spray them with cool water, especially on the legs and feet or stand them in cool water. Use sprinklers or hoses for cattle, pigs and horses. Starting from the feet and moving up slowly. Lay wet towels over them. Poultry should not be wet down unless there is a breeze to aid the cooling process. *Increase air movement with fans, ventilation, or wind/breeze.

What's New in 2022

As we move into our first full face to face fair since Covid pandemic, there are some changes in store for this year's fair.

- County qualifying is not required in any project area. Counties still need to certify the entries and work within the animal allocation process.
- Dormitories will NOT be available for the 2022 fair. Camping and hotels in the area is available.
- Junior division has been added in each of the judging contest. Juniors do not have to give oral reasons.
- Live kitchen activities will NOT held this year.
- Public Presentations have a virtual option for 2022
- Equine - Reining is added to the Senior Performance Section. Western Dressage is dropped from all performance sections.
- Equine - Small equine is an addition to the State 4-H Fair and will combine with the harness section.
- Dog obedience schedule has been reduced to six days.



Kitchen activities - there is a virtual option for any 4-H member wishing to participate. 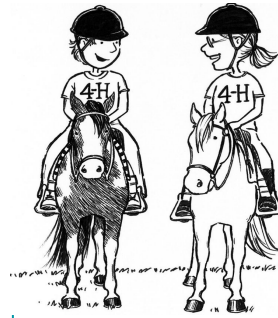

CANNING / PRESERVATION

Canning questions?

How much psi do I need for pressure canning? How high should the water be on jars in a pressure canner or hot water bath? What happens if I use 15 lbs pressure instead of 10 lbs pressure when canning tomatoes? Do you have these questions or need your Pressure gauge tested? WSU Extension has a Master Food Preserver available to answer your questions and to have your pressure gauges tested. Pressure gauges need to be calibrated at regular intervals, as using inaccurate equipment could lead to safety issues, production downtime or faulty products.
