WSU Extension Helps Implement New 988 Suicide Prevention Hotline



As of July 16, anyone in the United States can call or text the number 9-8-8, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, if they or someone they know shows signs of crisis, especially suicide. The number works much like 911, with calls routed

based on where someone is calling from. For states that don't have local services established, calls automatically reroute to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. "This stems from the need to be available for mental health emergencies," said Don McMoran, a Washington State University Agriculture and Natural Resources Extension educator and member of Washington's taskforce for implementing 988. "Everyone knows you call 911 in an emergency. Mental health has a lot of numbers available, so 988 should be easier to remember when time is vital." McMoran leads the Farm and Ranch Stress Assistance Network, which covers 13 western states and four U.S. territories. Thanks to a \$7 million U.S. Department of Agriculture grant. WSU Extension has several active programs working to reduce and eliminate suicide in the state. "Suicide is the second-leading cause of death for teens in Washington," said Ashley Hall, a 4-H assistant professor based in Snohomish County. To read the rest of this story visit our website:

This gives us much more room to fill with 4-H exhibits. No entry fee for 4-H exhibits in the 4-H section in the Modern Living Building.

4-H Contests and Events - Modern Living Building

Entry fees for the Modern Living building 4-H exhibits will be free. All entries are due **September 10 from Noon to 6:00 pm**. Information on contests and the entry form is available on the 4-H website. <u>Contests Information & Entry form</u>

<u>4-H PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS.</u> All Yakima County 4-H'ers are invited to give a Public Presentation related to a project in which you are enrolled. Contest held in the Modern Living Building during the CWSF. All 4-H Activities will be held on Saturday or Sunday, September 24 or 25 or October 1 or 2. Entries need to be submitted by September 10. No late entries accepted. We will assign a time for your presentation.

<u>4-H KITCHEN ACTIVITY</u> is open to all 4-H members enrolled in Food Projects or Adventures in Family Living. Activity will be **Saturday or Sunday, September 24 or 25 or October 1 or 2.** Juniors prepare a recipe using guidelines in the Project Book. Intermediates and Seniors prepare a bread or canned/frozen product as in the County Food Activity or prepare a favorite food. Time is limited to 1 hour for activity in kitchen. Sign up early to reserve your time spot.

Participants need to turn in a recipe, include all of ingredients to the Superintendent at the time of your activity. Food demonstrations may not be duplicated as food preparation. You need to bring your own equipment and posters. Must be taken home the day of the activity, there is no storage available.

<u>4-H PERFORMING ARTS / TALENT SHOW</u>. If more than one person is in the act, please list leader's name and the name of your club on one form and list all members participating on the back. Be sure to include first and last names, age, leader's phone number and the act to be performed. Use **ONE FORM FOR EACH ACT!** You **MUST** check in at the Modern Living Building by **2:00 pm on Sunday, October 2**. This event starts promptly at **2:00 pm** in the Modern Living Building.

4-H FASHION REVUE / CREATIVE CONSUMERS OF FASHION. Activity will be Sunday, October 2 at 2:00 pm. The clothes that are entered and on display at the fair will be available for you to model and a dressing area will be available. Your commentary should include a description of your outfit, trims and/or accessories used, material you used, what you learned, the school you are attending and grade, and any other activities and interests you have!

CHILI CONTEST New this year! Chili contest will be October 2. To Enter it is required to bring recipe and entry form on Sept 10. Limited to 20 people, if there is more interest and not 20 entries, it will be open to other youth. 4-H has priority. You will need to bring all your own equipment and food ingredients you need to prepare and cook the chili. WE HAVE TO HAVE A COPY OF THE RECIPE AND ENTRY FORM ON SEPTEMBER 10, so we can be sure to have enough room for all! You will come in early on contest day (October 2) for prep and start the cooking. All crockpots need to be plugged in by 11:00 am. You can go enjoy the fair while the chili is cooking. The judging and tasting will be done at 4:00 pm that day! You must be here!! You will have to talk to the judges during the judging time. Awards will be announced at the end of the judging. See you at the fair!

Central Washington State Fair will feature 4-H Quilt Squares on a Stick this fall!

A new display this fall will be the "Quilt Square on a Stick" at the Central Washington State Fair. 4-H youth members are invited to make a quilt square out of any materials they desire to use that are attached to a paint stick. The quilt square size is 8 inches wide by 9

tall. The theme of this year's contest will be Yakima Valley Agriculture. The quilt square may showcase crops grown here in the valley, the people of agriculture, landscape, or any other feature of agriculture here in Yakima Valley. Yakima County 4-H will host 2 events to provide materials for youth to make their quilt square for the fair. There is no entry fee to participate. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st place, 2nd place and 3rd place for Junior, Intermediate and Senior Divisions. All cloverbuds will receive a ribbon.

What's New in 2022

As we move into our first full face to face fair since Covid pandemic, there are some changes in store for this year's fair. WANT TO PARTICIPATE - CONTACT THE EXTENSION OFFICE IMMEDIATELY. Don't need to contact us if you already have your entry done.

- County qualifying is not required in any project area. Counties still need to certify the entries and work within the animal allocation process.
- Dormitories will NOT be available for the 2022 fair. Camping and hotels in the area is available.
- Junior division has been added in each of the judging contest. Juniors do not have to give oral reasons.
- Live kitchen activities will NOT held this year.
- Public Presentations have a virtual option for 2022
- Equine Reining is added to the Senior Performance Section. Western Dressage is dropped from all performance sections.
- Equine Small equine is an addition to the State 4-H Fair and will combine with the harness section.
- Dog obedience schedule has been reduced to six days.


